Report Canadian Jets For Reborn German Air Force. TORONTO, (CP)—The Globe and Mail says in a newspaper story today it has learned that large numbers of Canadian-built Sabre jets are destined for the German Air Force when it is reborn. The story says: "Once the European defence community pact is ratified, permitting the Germans to re-arm, a wholesale transfer is envisioned. 'The Royal Air Force has upward of 400 Sabres, a mutual aid gift of Canada and the United States... The British aircraft industry has in the works a Sabre successor, the sleek Hawker Hunter...'
