The Channel Tunnel

The long hypothetical struggle over the proposed construction of a submarine tunnel between France and England has come down through two generations of more into an atmosphere more favorable for its consideration than has ever existed before.

The first scheme submitted was in 1856, when Queen Victoria and the Prince Consort, favoured it. They had crossed the Channel in steamers. It was nearly twenty years later when a convention was signed by the French government to regulate its use when built, but a select committee of the House of Commons rejected the proposal.

The most extraordinary arguments against it were circulated and there is no doubt that a great many honest Britons thought that the danger of continental enemies getting hold of the tunnel and rushing through some night and murdering everybody in their beds was inevitable.

The era of flying man has banished the tunnel dream by imposing a more recent and more imminent danger. The tunnel is now called in, not only to counteract the aeroplane, but also to checkmate the submarine.
