# 1,100 Boats Said Ready For '62 Lobster Season

Island lobster fishermen are readying boats, traps and equipment for the opening date of the season, which will see some 2,500 fishermen, using about 1,100 boats to set an estimated 400,000 traps for the two-month season, which ends June 30.

Boats will race for the fishing grounds at 10 o'clock Monday morning, April 30, but no lobsters are permitted to be landed before May 1 - still the official opening date for the season in the area running from North Cape along the north, east and south shores, to Victoria.

## Labor Surpluses Seen In 68 Areas

OTTAWA (CP) — There were substantial labor surpluses during February in 68 of the 110 Canadian urban areas with work forces of 10,000 or more, the labor department reported Monday.

In 1961, 9,511,260 pounds of lobsters were landed and this catch had a landed value of \$3,054,956.

Last year's catch and value were both down slightly from 1960, and this was attributed to the later start last year because of ice conditions.

Fisheries officials said yesterday, however, that there will probably be no delay this year as ice is melting fast in

the later season, from Aug. 9 to Oct. 10, will bring the overall figures to approximately 3,000 fishermen, 1,500 boats and 450,000 traps.

The monthly publication, Labor Gazette, said there were no shortages of labor in any of the 110 areas.

Moderate labor surpluses were reported in 41 centres.

Metropolitan areas with substantial labor surpluses included Calgary, Edmonton, Quebec City and Lewis, St. John's, Nfld., Vancouver and New Westminster, Windsor, Ont., and Winnipeg.

Areas with moderate labor surpluses included Halifax, Ottawa, Montreal and Hull, Que. Rouyn and Val d'Or, Que., major mining areas, moved into the substantial labor surplus bracket.

Fredericton, Lachute and Ste. Therese, Que., also became areas with substantial labor surpluses after having moderate surpluses in January.

He was a delegate to the NATO Parliamentarians' Conference in Paris in 1960 and was elected chairman of the executive committee of the Canadian NATO parliamentarians' Branch in 1962.

Mr. MacLellan was chairman of a special select committee on the Civil Service Superannuation Act in 1960 and chairman of a committee on revision of the Civil Service Act last year.

The Inverness member is also active on the following House of Commons committees: external affairs, fisheries, banking and commerce, public accounts and estimates.

## Indian Makes Mark As Pilot

MOOSONEE, Ont. (CP) — A handsome 23-year-old Indian named after flyer Charles A. Lindbergh is blazing new trails for his race as a bush pilot in Northern Ontario.

Lindbergh Loutit—Lindy to his friends—was born at Attawapiskat on the west coast of James Bay in October, 1938, about three months after Lindbergh made a flying visit to the area.

An expert trapper, hunter, guide and cook, Lindbergh Loutit received his commercial pilot's licence last November after taking a pilot training course with Laurentide Aviation Limited in Montreal. He is one of the first Indians in Canada to receive both his private and commercial licences.

Lindy now is employed by Austin Airways, flying out of this James Bay port as a co-pilot on DC-3 aircraft. He will go on to pilot both twin-engine and single-engine planes in bush flying operations in the Canadian North.

Lindy has one advantage over most bush pilots. He speaks English, Cree and Eskimo fluently.
