TUITION FEES: 101 WAYS TO FINANCE AN EDUCATION.

The hardest college subject these days may be figuring out how to come up with spiraling tuition fees, but more and more universities are developing "creative financing plans" to help students foot the bills.

American President Reagan's Alma Mater, Eureka College in Illinois, raised \$28,000 from alumni by an "adopt a student" appeal; the university of Idaho and several other schools are offering discounts to students who can pay cash up front: and Yale allows tuition fee payments over 30 years.

While colleges scramble to cope with cuts in federal aid, some states are lending a helping hand: Pennsylvania governor Dick Thornburgh authorized the sale of up to \$300 million in bonds annually to help finance student loans.
