CENTENARIANS.—The death is reported in Halifax of Mrs. Mary Lightizer, authentically stated to be 112 years of age. The deceased had been blind for many years and finally became weary of life. Another papers announce the demise of Mr. William Moody, of Gulf Shore, aged 102. Last Saturday he swung the scythe in the hayfield in good style. His faculties were well preserved to the close of life. At Southampton, N. S., Martin Hogg died recently at the age of 100 years and three days. He raked hay with uncommon agility the week before he died.

News From Labrador.

The commander of the government steamer La Canadienne, at Gaspe, from Labrador, reports having passed icebergs ashore in fifty fathoms of water, some of which were from one to two miles long, off the eastern entrance to the Straits. Icebergs have been reported of unusual size, one said to be seven miles long. The seal fishery of last fall with nets was better than usual, some of the fishers having taken from 1,000 to 1,500 seals. The spring seal fishing in the ice was a total failure. To the westward of Natashquan the cod fishery is better, but it will not return more than half an average. There will be great distress during the coming winter at some points, and it will be necessary to send supplies or have the people removed.

Vegetarianism has made such headway in Germany that its literature on the subject now covers seven hundred volumes. There is, moreover, a monthly devoted to the ism, and an organization called "The German Society for Promoting a Harmless Minister of Life."
