## ROCKET PLASTED

LONDON (AP) — Britain scrapped production of its "Blue Streak" nuclear artillery missile Friday and stirred up a political tizzy.

George Brown, deputy leader of the opposition Labor party and its defence spokesman, accused the government of cancelling "the most calamitous and costly defence middle ever."

He said Britain is still without any coherent policy of weapons program "despite 11 years of what is called the successive (defence) ministers during which we have spent more than \$16,000,000,000."

The cancelled missile is a 75-mile-range tactical support rocket originally due for army service in 1965. Its cancellation is expected to bring unemployment to not less than 2,000 men at the British Aircraft Corporation's plant.
