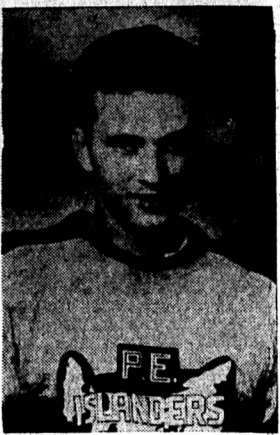


Islanders Score Second Shutout Of Season

Defeat Halifax St. Mary's 2-0 Here In Close Checking Game

Second Shutout

Two goals in the first period by a Walter Pawlyshyn-Bucko Trio combination paved the way for a 2-0 victory for Leo Lamoureux's Islanders and the second shut-out of the season for goalie Hal Gordon, over the Halifax St. Mary's pucksters in a close-checking Maritime Senior Hockey League contest here at the Forum last night.

With both teams icing full rosters that made it a nip-and-tuck contest all the way, the game produced a wide-open and fast first frame and a close to the vest second and third period play that gave a good sized crowd of fans plenty of smart hockey and excitement.

With Bruno "Red" Favero also assisting in Islanders opening tally, both were chalked up on two of the prettiest plays that have been witnessed here this season.

Forcing the attack deep in the Halifax zone early in the first period, Trainer took Favero's pass past inside the opposing blue-line, worked his way around a couple of Halifax players right in to the right side of Eddie D'Aoust before slipping a short pass right in front of the net to Walter Pawlyshyn who banged it home at the 3:35 mark.

Holding a slight edge on the play at times, while fighting off dangerous Halifax passing attacks at others, Islanders finally broke through again at the 16:14 mark of the frame after nearly a full period of fast changing attacks that kept both goalies on their toes. Breaking up a Halifax attack at his own blue-line Pawlyshyn broke down the ice with Trainer to carry right in on goal with two men back, slipped a pass to Trainer about ten feet out, who cut anglewise across the front of the net to bang it past D'Aoust at the far left corner. Islanders were playing a man short on their second effort, Frank Bathgate serving two minutes for elbowing.

It was a close-checking game of hockey for a scoreless second and third period with both goalies Eddie D'Aoust and Hal Gordon coming up with some startling saves during hard-pressing and fast, dangerous attacks, with the latter in particular being outstanding in his shut-out performance. Halifax held the opening advantage in both frames while Islanders pressed the attack in the closing halves.

With both squads handing out the bumps right and left, it was a rousing two periods of hockey, and although not so open as the first frame, gave the fans plenty of rousing action.

Making his first appearance with Halifax before a Charlottetown crowd this season, rearguard Johnny Myketyrn turned in a solid performance with the Santamarans blue-line corps with hard body checks and smart clearing, while Vitale, Dutchak, Travis and McLagan were sold all the way in Islanders defensive tactics.

Although the body checks were coming fast and often, it was a game that stayed well under control throughout most of the contest with only eight penalties being handed out, six going to Islanders while Don "Peanuts" McLaughlin served both sentences for Halifax. All were for minor infractions.

Shots on goal were about the closest this season, with Islanders holding the slight edge with 27 on D'Aoust and 25 on Gordon. The two shot margin was in the first period when Islanders out-shot Halifax 10 to 8. Both Gordon and D'Aoust handled the same number of shots in the two final frames, eight each in the second and nine in the third.

Don Newcombe Signs For \$20,000

BROOKLYN, Jan. 16 — (AP) — Don Newcombe, Brooklyn's jumbo-sized pitcher, signed his 1951 contract today for a reported \$20,000.

The big right-hander hit his stride after a slow start last spring and finished with a 19-11 record for the runner-up Dodgers. He led the club with 20 complete games, 287 innings pitched and four shutouts.

Rookie of the year in 1949, Newcombe had arm trouble last spring. At the time of the All-Star game his record was a so-so 7-5. After the All-Star break he had a 12-6 record.

Hopes To Sign Charles For Bout

NEW YORK, Jan. 16 — (AP) — Babe McCoy, Los Angeles sports promoter, said today he hopes to sign heavyweight champion Ezzard Charles and Rex Layne of Lewiston, Utah, for a title bout early in May in Reno, Nevada.

"A group of Reno business men has authorized me to make the match," said McCoy, "and I am prepared to guarantee Charles \$100,000 and Layne \$25,000."

Charles, who stopped Lee Oma in the 10th round of a title fight, has been signed to defend his crown against Jersey Joe Walcott in Detroit, March 7. Layne, who upset Walcott in Madison Square Garden, Nov. 24, will meet Cesar Brion of Argentina in the Garden, Feb. 9.

Birdie Tebbets Signs Contract

CLEVELAND, Jan. 16 — (AP) — Peppery Birdie Tebbets, Cleveland's new catcher, has signed his 1951 contract. This brings to five the number signed. The other are Early Wynn and Steve Gromek, pitchers, and outfielders Larry Doby and Jim Lemon. Lemon, however, is due for the army.

The Indians also announced the appointment of Clare G. Hoese of Toronto as their first full-time talent scout in Canada.

Hoese has worked for the Indians on a part-time basis for three years, but the club said that this was the first time it would scout the Dominion the year round.

Cardinals Keep Bilko Away From Good Cooking

NEW YORK, Jan. 16 — (AP) — St. Louis Cardinals believe they have hit upon a plan that may produce that long-looked-for hard-hitting first baseman. They are keeping stout Steve Bilko as far away from his mother-in-law's cooking as possible.

To make sure there's no repetition of last spring when Bilko reported to the Cards' training camp 40 pounds overweight "because I just couldn't resist my mother-in-law's cooking," he was advised to play winter ball in Cuba.

That's 2,000 miles away from Nanticoke, Pa., where Bilko began eating himself out of the majors last year.

Bilko came up from Rochester of the triple-A International League. He was the League's runs-batted-in champion and had swatted 34 home runs. But the overweight bridegroom was soon back in Rochester.

Now he comes back for another 30 pounds lighter. He also brings with him a .293 batting mark.

Taking no chances of another Bilko bust, the Cards are bringing up three other rookie first-basemen. Also from Rochester comes Don Bolweg, a left-hand hitter who alternated with Bilko and who finished last season with the Cards. Bolweg batted .316 and drove in 60 runs.

The other aspirants are Ed Michelson and Harvey Zernia. Michelson hit .417 with Montgomery of the Class-B Southeastern League in 52 games and Zernia batted .318 at Omaha in the Class-A Western League.
