## 'Islander Of Year' Will Be Honored

Dr. Eric M. Fould, 'Islander of the Year' for 1962, will be publicly honored Monday in a ceremony to be held during a meeting of the Charlottetown Rotary Club at the Charlottetown Hotel.

A number of dignitaries including other former 'Islanders' will be present when Dr. Fould, medical superintendent of the provincial sanatorium, is presented with the 'Islander of the Year' award.

The presentation of the award will be made by Lieutenant-Governor F. Walter Hyndman.

Dr. Fould will receive two plaques: one will have his name inscribed on it and the other will be placed in a prominent place in Charlottetown until another 'Islander' is named next year and, the other, a smaller plaque, will be given him as a permanent keepsake and memento of the occasion.

**Mild January Record Shows**  
SUMMERSIDE — Although the province experienced a rather mild January, statistics revealed by the meteorological section at the RCAF station, where they have been keeping weather records for the past 14 years, show no great difference from the average January, although there was some variance.

The average snowfall for January over the past years has been 25 inches whereas only 17 inches fell on the Summerside area last month. Most of the snow disappeared as a result of rain and moderate temperatures and consequently very little remains on the ground.

The average temperature last month in this area was 24.1 degrees compared to an average of 19.7 degrees for the past 14 years. The highest temperature for the month was 43 degrees on January 24.

## Fish And Game Ass'n Adds Support To Wildlife Fund

The Provincial Fish and Game Association is adding its support to the Harvey Moore Wildlife Fund, which was established by The Patriot in 1959 to honor the late Mr. Harvey Moore, a well-known sportsman and conservationist.

The fund was created to provide financial assistance to young people who are showing a special interest in wildlife conservation and an aptitude for its promotion.

The fund will perpetuate the memory of the late Harvey Moore who built up an annual fish and game party at the Milltown Cross in his lifetime. He was born September 1916 and died May 1960, but he also intended to develop an interest in the sort of thing which Mr. Moore gave most of his time and energy through a lifetime that was unfortunately too brief.
