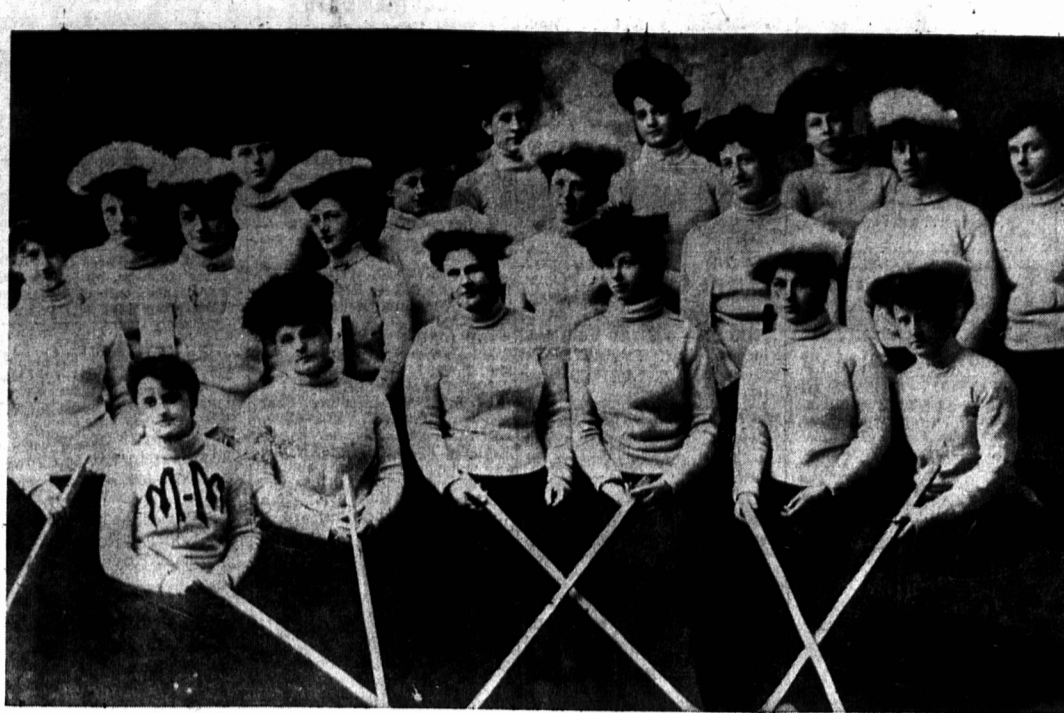
Centennial Greetings

South had the aforementioned habit of studying the dummy on every hand, so when he thought for a moment this time, he did not quail the alert signal for West.

There are not many defenders who would avoid the trap South laid, and West was not one of the exceptions.

South played the heart six from dummy and the seven from his own hand!

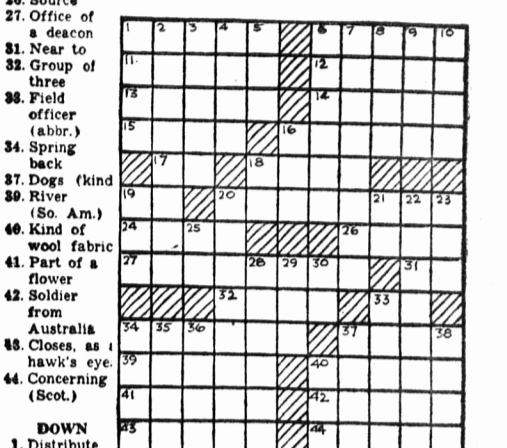
