

Humane Treatment of Horses.

Machinery is doing a vast amount of labor for man; but horses are not dispensed with; on the contrary, their number is increasing in this country every year.

Make the floor of the stall level instead of descending from the manger toward the rear, and use more and better absorbents. In so doing you not only save the most valuable part of the fertilizing product of the horse, but you remove the strain of standing with his hind feet lower than the forward one.

Don't work a horse all day on the farm and at night turn him out to pick up a scanty supper when he should be resting in the stable after eating.

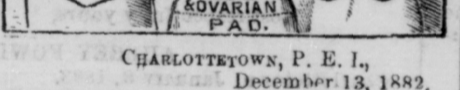
