ATTENTION POTATO GROWERS

The attention of all farmers is directed to an amendment of the Prince Edward Island Potato Production Act passed in 1962 whereby all persons planting one-quarter acre or more of potatoes must plant those of the "Certified" class or better unless written authority is received from the Minister of Agriculture.

Also be advised that any grower whose field or land has borne a crop of potatoes infected with any plant disease or pest shall not permit the same area to be planted to potatoes the following year except on the authority of an Inspector, and shall destroy any volunteer plants on such land.

Areas so infected in 1961 will be policed to see that these regulations are strictly enforced.
It is the intention to inspect all fields of potatoes grown this year and growers are advised to retain and have available for the Inspector their seed tags or the written authority from the Minister to plant seed of table stock origin.

ATTENTION Potato Growers And Operators Of Potato Machinery

All potato growers and operators of potato machinery are reminded of the amendment to the "Plant Disease Eradication Act" which has reference to the disinfecting of potato machinery and the registering annually of operators of such machines.

All farmers, or others, who operate Potato Planters, Set Cutters, and other equipment used in the handling of potatoes on more than their own farms, must apply immediately to the Provincial Department of Agriculture, Box 2000, Charlottetown, for a license and enclose the license fee of fifty cents (\$0.50). When application for a license is received a record book will be forwarded which will be evidence that the operator has registered. Operators of custom machines should contact the Seed Potato Inspector in their respective areas, or the Prince Edward Island Department of Agriculture, for instructions in the proper method of disinfecting their machines.

REMEMBER TO TREAT YOUR SEED BEFORE CUTTING. THIS WILL ASSIST IN COUNTERACTING FUSARIUM ROT INFECTION AND OTHER DISEASES.
