The funeral was held from St. Thomas' Anglican Church, following a short service at his late home on Wednesday afternoon and was largely attended. His minister, the Rev. Robert Coupland, officiated and was assisted by the Rev. S. H. Haslam of the United Church. With Mrs. John McKay at the organ, the choir led in the singing of the hymns: "The Lord's My Shepherd," "The Sands of Time are Sinking," "There is No Night in Heaven," and "Jesus Saviour, Pilot Me." The pallbearers were six grandsons: Fred, Francis, Daniel, Layton, Robert, and Elwood Dunning. The floral tributes were numerous and beautiful. Burial was in St. Thomas' Cemetery, New London. -Bur.

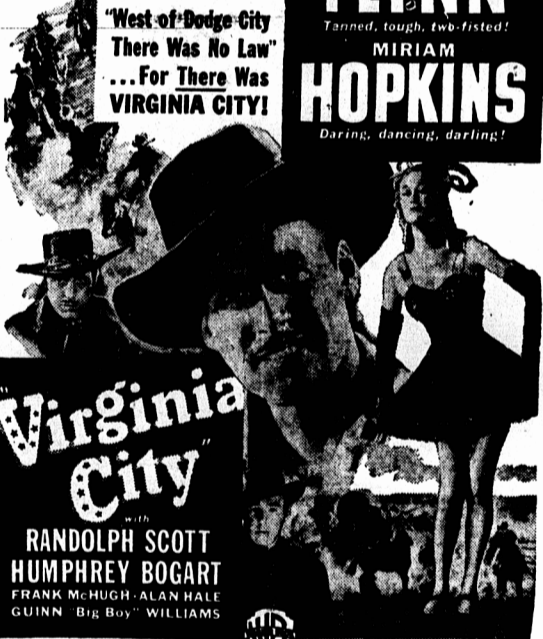
