Bishop Watterman On Annual Visit To Alberton Parish

The Right Rev. R.H. Watterman, D.D., Lord Bishop of Nova Scotia, is making his annual visitation to the Anglican parish of Alberton today. He will dedicate two beautiful altars of hand carved Island oak, one at St. Peter's Church Alberton and the other at Holy Trinity Church, Alma.

The ceremony at Alma will take place at 2 p.m. The altar there will be dedicated in loving memory of Mr. and Mrs. Spurgeon Jeffery, a gift of their children, George and Eva.

At Alberton the ceremony will be at 8 p.m. The altar will be in memory of George David Harris, 19 years of age, student of theology at King's College, who was drowned near Alberton in 1928 while serving the parish during the summer months.

These altars were made by the M.F. Schurman Co., Summerside, and are the product of the skilled workmanship of Mr. Dunn. Blueprints were by Mr. Williams from sketches submitted by the Rector, Rev. J.R. McMahon and Mrs. W. J. Phillips. Mrs. Phillips did the beautiful wood carving.

From 3.15 p.m. to 4.00 o'clock the navy band from H. M. C. S. Stadacona will provide band music.

At 3.40 p.m. a Lancaster paratroop will illustrate to the public how air borne supplies are dropped to people lost at sea or in the woods. At 4.00 p.m. there will be an interesting model aircraft flying display. At 4.05 there will be a Harvard aerobatic display in which among other air activities, Harvard aircraft will play "Follow the leader" within the limit of the air-drome, at a low level, providing plenty of thrills to the audience on the ground watching the aircraft maneuvers.

All during the airshow there will be a commentator who, by means of a public address system, will explain to the public the various manoeuvres the aircraft will do. Loud speakers of the public address system will be set up both inside and in front of the static display hangar, so that the commentator can be heard by all.

Inside the static display hangar will be located an information booth, first aid post, and refreshment booth, all for the specific benefit of the visiting public. This hangar will be filled with booths containing various displays from the different sections of the airport.

At 5.05 p.m. there will be a Lancaster bomber demonstration in which the Lancaster will fly past using four engines, turn and come back on three engines, and turning again will come past again on two engines only. It will then turn and do a low level bombing run, bombing a small target located in plain view on the field where it can easily be seen by the audience on the ground.

At 3.15 p.m. the lucky winners of the leaflet contest will take off on a flight over Prince Edward Island.

Much Interest In Leaflets Dropped By R.C.A.F. Planes

Yesterday afternoon, aircraft from the Summerside station, flew over six Island communities and dropped 34,000 leaflets that for six persons who collected the most of these leaflets will mean a thrilling and enjoyable plane ride over many sections of Prince Edward Island in an R. C. A. F. Dakota aircraft.

15,000 of these leaflets were dropped over Charlottetown, 7,000 over Summerside and 3,000 each over Souris, Montague, Alberton, O'Leary. The leaflets contain an invitation to the general public on Prince Edward Island for them to attend the Air Force Day programme beginning at 1.00 p.m. at C. A. F. station, Summerside tomorrow afternoon.

It also contains the information that the six persons who turn in the largest number of the hand-bills at the main gate on the air station before 2.00 p.m. on Saturday will be given a free ride in the Dakota aircraft. This aircraft, with the contest winners will leave on its flight at 3.15 p.m.

Reports last night from the centres where the leaflets were dropped indicated great interest in the contest and it would appear that the R. C. A. F. had best be prepared on Saturday for the most eager passengers they have ever flown.
