New Model By Chrysler Corp.

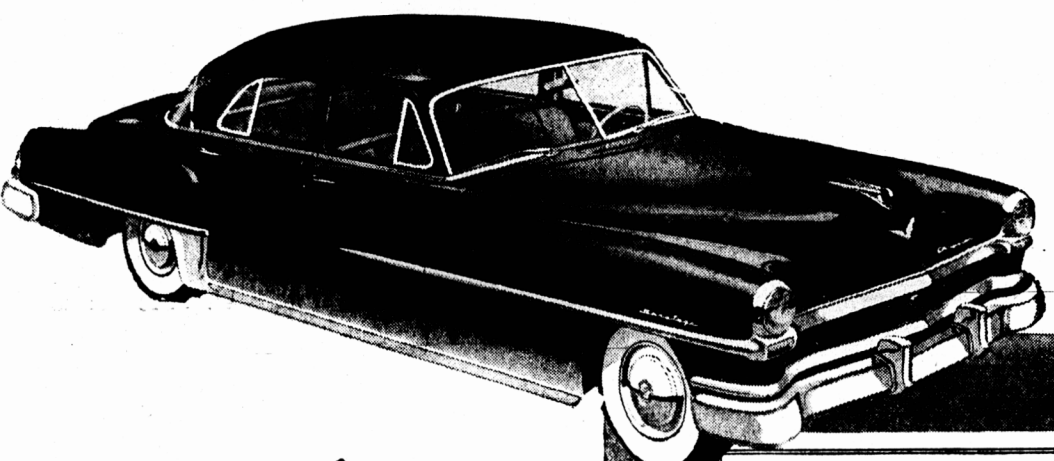
The wide range of Chrysler models for 1952 will include the Chrysler Saratoga, a car with 125 1-2 inch wheelbase and the 180 horsepower Firepower V-8 engine built in Canada, according to John C. McGuire, general sales manager of the Chrysler-Plymouth-Fargo Division of the Chrysler Corporation of Canada. The first Canadian-built Firepower V-8 engine rolled off the new manufacturing line of some weeks ago. Recently installed in the enlarged Motor plant is a 200 foot long production line designed solely for the building of the famous Firepower engine.

"The Saratoga is the greatest performing car on the road" claimed Mr. McGuire, "for it is a perfectly balanced mechanism, with an abundance of power for performance safety and economy. The Firepower engine of the Saratoga has become the most enthusiastically acclaimed and the most widely discussed automobile engine ever introduced. The hemispherical or cup-shaped combustion chambers of the Firepower V-8 engine are just one of the outstanding features of this engine" said Mr. McGuire. 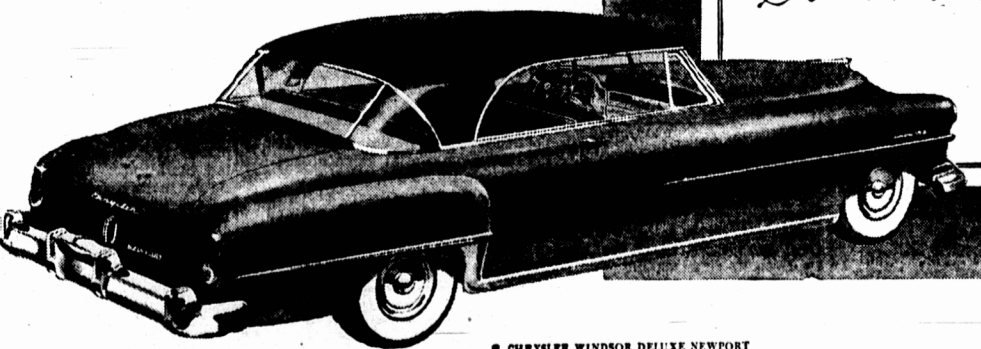
