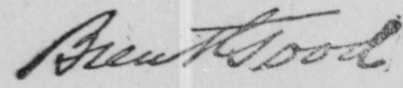


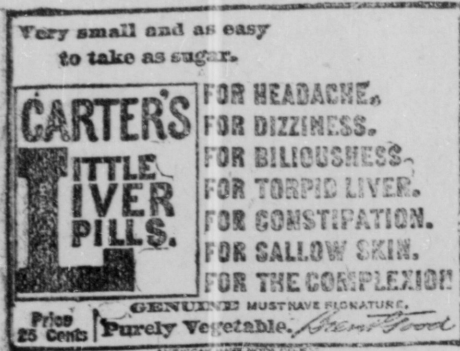

## THE RECOUNT.

## MURRAY HARBOR IN LINE.

At the Liberal-Conservative convention at Murray Harbor yesterday Messrs. Murdock McKinnon and J. A. Mathieson were nominated to oppose Messrs. Bruce and Annear, the Government nominees. Mr. Prowse's business engagements would not admit of his accepting a re-nomination.

## THE FINANCIAL RECORD.

We publish, to day, in black letter figures, the financial record of the party now in office, and ask the attention of every voter. The total expenditures of the contending parties are given in parallel columns. Those who remember how our roads and schools, etc., were maintained previous to 1890, at less cost, may now make a comparison of the same service since that date at the greater cost.

# THE RETORT COURTEOUS.

If THE EXAMINER has indulged in "slurs and insults" with reference to the Hon. Benjamin Rogers, it deserves rebuke, the more so that Mr. Rogers is absent. We are not in the habit of slurring at or insulting any man, let alone an estimable citizen.

By the way if, as Mr. George J. Rogers says, "previous to his departure for Europe Mr. Rogers had firmly refused to allow his name to be mentioned for re-nomination," why were his wishes not respected? Why was one of his sons canvassing for him on the day previous to the first meeting of the Liberal delegates? Why was Mr. Rogers actually nominated at this first meeting? And why did Mr. Rogers, when asked by telegram whether he would consent to be nominated, reply, "Will nominate if party thinks best?" We protest that THE EXAMINER, and we believe, the public, had not the "faintest idea that Mr. Rogers had firmly refused" to be even mentioned for re-nomination. Nor had we been informed that he resigned his seat in the Executive Council. We supposed that he was still a member of the government prepared to stand or fall with the government. We knew, moreover, that he had actually been placed in nomination by his party, his sons being consenting parties; and we had heard that his reply to the telegram sent him was, in effect, that he was "willing to run if his party desired him to do so." The next day we heard, with astonishment, that at an adjourned meeting of the delegates Mr. Rogers was turned down and Mr. George E. Hughes nominated by a vote of 22 to 20.

Now, we are in the judgment of reasonable citizens; and we ask if, in these circumstances, we are to be condemned for casting slurs and insults on Mr. Rogers because THE EXAMINER remarked that he had received "a cold crack?"—further, if in these circumstances the slur and insult are not rather, those of his own partisans who, with his telegram before them, placing himself in their hands, turned him down? Citizens, friends of Mr. Rogers, were, on the day following the extraordinary VOLTE FACE, outspoken in their denunciation of the shabby treatment he had received, and in their surprise that Mr. Hughes would, in the circumstances, and with only a majority of two in the convention, consent to take the place which Mr. Rogers had expressed his willingness to fill; and THE EXAMINER merely gave expression to their thought.

It is the opinion of Lord Strathcona, who is probably well informed in the matter, that the Canadian Australian cable will be ready in two years. He described it as a living issue. It is a vast enterprise, involving the expenditure of about £2,000,000, and will come about in good time. There are five Governments interested besides this immense amount of capital, so if things seem to go a little slowly we must remember these things. Statesmen in England are very much in favor of it. He reminds us that one element to be considered is the increase in the price of material used in cable construction. The rubber for instance, has become much dearer.
