Egyptian Premier Makes Fiery Address On Suez

CAIRO (Reuters)—Premier Mohamed Naguib said Sunday "we have washed our hands of Anglo-Egyptian negotiations on the Suez canal."

"We are nearing a great battle and every Egyptian should be ready for the supreme sacrifice," the Egyptian premier said in a speech delivered from a high dais facing the grave of Egypt's unknown soldier.

In other parts of the speech Naguib referred to Britain as "the enemy."

The Anglo-Egyptian talks on Suez, which Egypt wants Britain to evacuate unconditionally, have been suspended. The speech was an announcement that the talks have been broken off, however.

The fiery words, which echoed statements in the last few days about an approaching "national struggle, seemed aimed at satisfying the more impatient members of Naguib's revolutionary council, and impressing United States Secretary of State Dulles, who arrives here Monday on his Mid-East tour.
