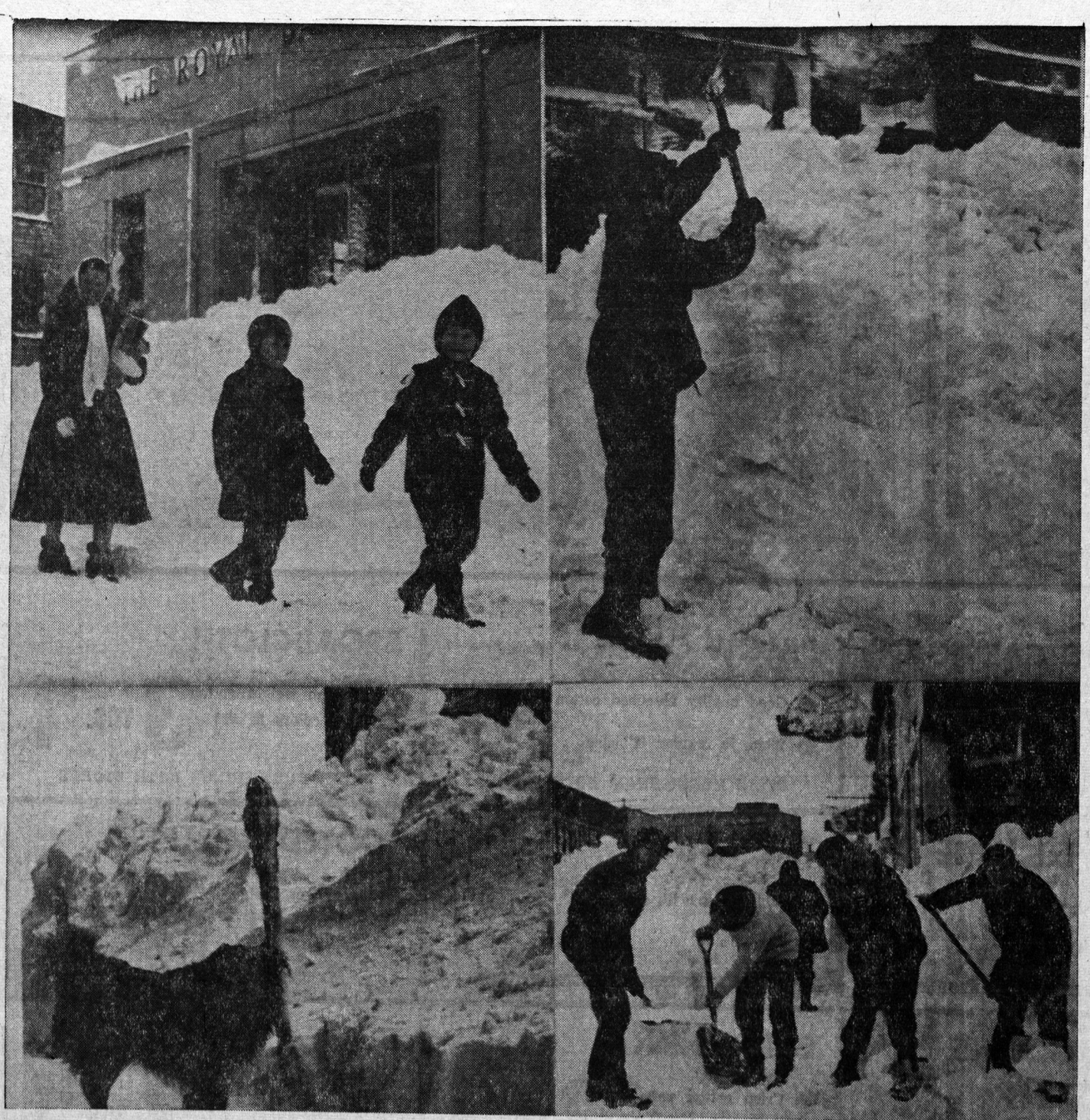

Plans Made To Increase Flow Of Refugees Here

OTTAWA (CP) — Arrangements have been completed for the movement of an additional 2,476 Hungarian refugees to Canada from Austria in February, the immigration department announced Wednesday.

This increases to 22,476 from 20,000 the number of Hungarians Canada now is committed to bring to this country. Of the total, 10,000 will have arrived from Austria by the end of January, another 2,476 from Austria by the end of February and 2,000 from The Netherlands, 3,000 from France and 5,000 from the United Kingdom after March 1. Arrivals to date total 7,891.
