The Reds will have rookie Tommy Harper in centre field, and possibly Pete Rose at second base. Rose moved up to the varsity over the weekend after sparkling in Florida. However, Don Blasingame is the holdover at second base.

Pittsburgh will have a new infield with only Bill Mazeroski, the second baseman, remaining from the 1962 quarter. Rookie Bob Bailey at third, Dick Schofield at short and Donn Clendenon at first are the replacements.
