GENERAL TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

St. Petersburg, Nov. 23.—The Novosti and St. Petersburg Gazette says if England will come to terms with the Egyptian and eastern questions, a triple alliance, consisting of England, Russia and France, would be perfectly practicable.

St. Petersburg, Nov. 23.—The marriage of the Czar and Princess Alix of Hesse-Darmstadt was celebrated today by M. DeGiers, Minister of Foreign Affairs, and by Count Vorontsoff-Dachkoff, Minister of the Imperial Court.

Ottawa, Nov. 23.—Commander Spain, who has had charge of the Atlantic fishery protection service during the past summer, returned to Ottawa today. He says the license system worked well and that the New England fishermen have given little trouble. There were only two seizures during the entire season.

New York, Nov. 23.—According to the Commercial Advertiser, the elevation of Mr. Salotti to the cardinalate will take place on or about the first day of the legislative session, which occurs on Dec. 8th. The Commercial Advertiser adds that Cardinal Gibbons has delayed his departure for Rome in order to be present at the ceremony.

London, Nov. 23.—Bullion in the Bank for England decreased £39,981 during the past week. Proportion of Bank of England ready to liability, which last week was £300 per cent., now £447 per cent. Bank of England rate of discount remains at 2 per cent.

Paris, Nov. 23.—In the chamber of deputies yesterday, Paschal Grousset, radical, made the debate on the question of granting credit and sanctioning an expedition to Madagascar be adjourned until the general situation could be carefully studied. The motion was defeated by the overwhelming majority of 366. M. Jourdan, socialist, opposed the motion and spoke at length against the proposal to send an expedition to Madagascar.
