

Oil Delivery Man Now Eases Users' Low Oil Supply Fears

Going south for the winter and worried that pipes might be frozen? Well, don't worry. Just tell your oil delivery man and he will see that there is always an adequate supply of oil around to keep the furnace going and thus prevent frozen pipes.

This is only one of many services your oil delivery man will do for you, and when winter comes, which it will shortly to this island province, the oil delivery man will be the man of the hour.

For come rain, snow and freezing temperatures you need never worry about running out of oil. Just as surely as the tank gauge dips to the low mark you can be sure that the driver will arrive to fill it up. Ninety-nine per cent of the time you do not even have to phone him.

JITTERS FADING

The "maybe we're short of oil" jitters are fast becoming a thing

of the past. Numerous oil distributors today know when you need a supply of oil better than you do yourself, by a weather-controlled system the driver knows when you need the oil and delivers it automatically.

The system was devised by heating engineers who discovered that the amount of oil needed to heat a house varies according

to how far the outside temperature falls below 65 degrees.

Using this method distributors can keep a record of the users' rate of fuel consumption for any weather and establish a safe reserve level of fuel. When the supply reaches this reserve level the company schedules a re-filling. It is as simple as that and a great relief to the consumer who worries that he might run out of oil at inopportune moments.

GOVERNMENT METER

All quantities of oil delivered are automatically measured by government inspected meter. An invoice is stamped in the meter measuring the quantity of oil delivered in the tank.

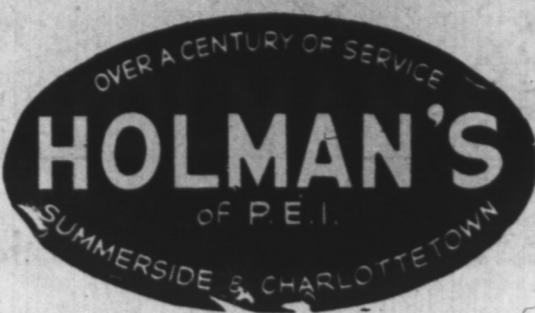

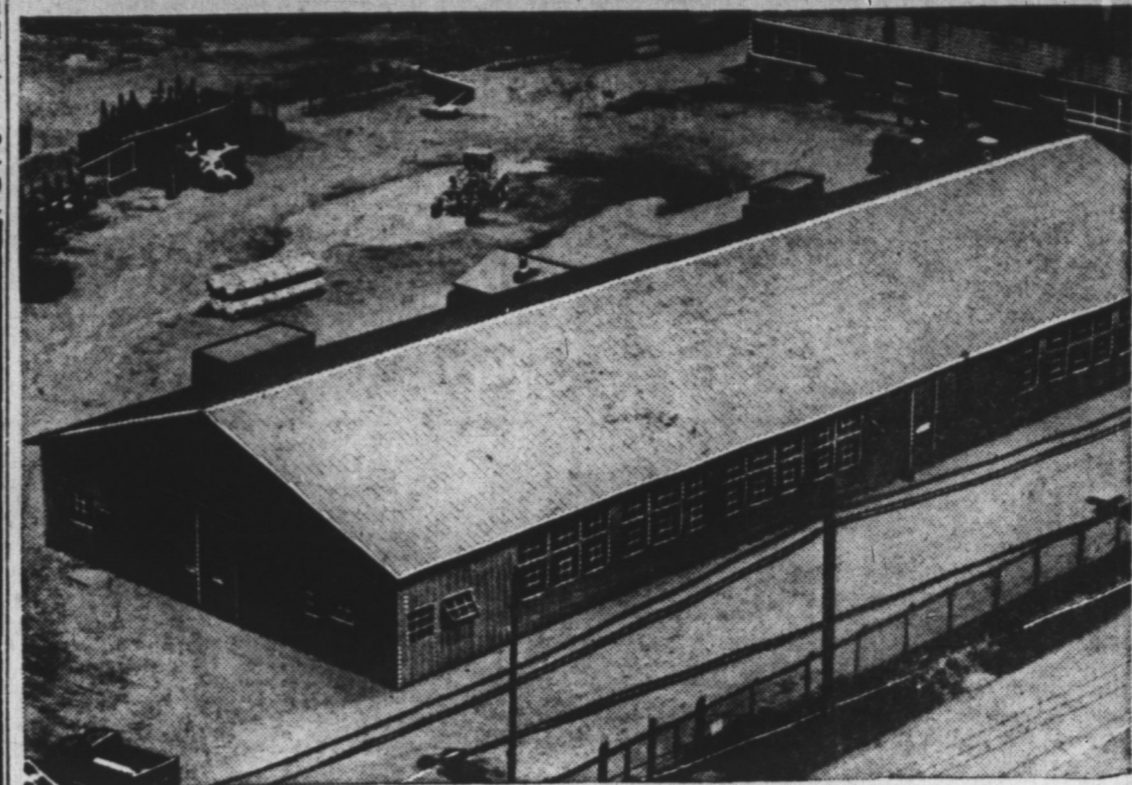
