IN MEMORIAM

HUGH A. CAMPBELL

News of the passing of Hugh A. Campbell of Graham's Road at the Prince County Hospital on May 25th, brought deep grief to the loving home circle, and saddened the community and many hearts beyond.

Mr. Campbell was born on the old Campbell homestead on Feb. 21st, 1896, and was the youngest son of James Andrew and Christina Lamont Campbell. He received his early education in the district school and later attended Prince of Wales College.

On Sept. 15th, 1920, he was united in marriage with Jessie Mackay of New London, who through the years proved a worthy help mate and tenderly and devotedly cared for him during his long illness.

Mr. Campbell was a man of high ideals, integrity and honor; always interested in the welfare of others, and foremost in the promotion and extension of any worth while project. His counsel was invariably sought on matters of import; while his rare personality combining modesty and charm endeared him to his friends and acquaintances.

He will be greatly missed in the community in which he was so interested. The funeral under the direction of J.L. Davison, which was held from the home on Monday, May 28th, at 2 o'clock was largely attended. Service was conducted by his pastor, Rev. S.H. Haslam. Hymns sung were, "Unto the Hills" and "The Lord's My Shepherd" favorites of the deceased. Pallbearers were Fred Campbell, Francis Murray, Ray MacLeod, John MacGregor, Bert MacKay, and Arnel MacKinnon.

Interment was in the New London cemetery. The floral tributes were many and beautiful testifying to the high esteem in which he was held.

Treasure Quest Is Abandoned

PIETERMARITZBURG, South Africa (Reuters) — An expedition which set out last month to seek the lost "treasure hoard" city of the Kalahari desert has abandoned its quest, one of the seven members reported by telegram Wednesday.

The ruins of the city were discovered in 1885, by A. A. Farini, an American explorer. They have since been sought in vain by a number of expeditions.

Alan Paton, the best-selling author, reported in Wednesday's telegram the party was returning here after searching the trackless and waterless Aha Mountains. Paton said the search was restricted because of shortage of time but the party was convinced that one day the lost city will be found.
