**Contract Bridge**

**LEAVING-IN PARTNER'S DOUBLES**  
 There are no "nevers" in bridge—no "rules" so rigid that they must never be broken. There are, however, certain bids (and plays) which experts try very hard to avoid.  
 One of these is leaving in partner's penalty double of a relatively low bid when void of the doubled suit. They are too well aware of the defensive difficulties that arise in such cases—deals like the following, for example:

East dealer.  
 Both sides vulnerable.  
 ♠ Q J 8 5 4  
 ♥ 8 2  
 ♦ 6 4  
 ♣ 10 5 3 2  
 ♠ A K 10  
 ♥ W E  
 ♦ K J 8 7  
 ♣ A K 10  
 ♠ Q 5 4  
 ♥ 7 5  
 ♦ Q 5 4  
 ♣ A J 6

The bidding:  
 East South West North  
 1 ♠ Pass Pass 2♣ Pass

In the "postmortem," East said that he had felt perfectly justified in leaving in the two-heart double because he had four plus honors in his hand—a respectable "overage" insofar as his opening bid was concerned. Unfortunately for his side, however, this high-card holding was not fully effective on defense!

West opened his top spade, East captured dummy's jack and laid down the diamond king and ace, then shifted to his lowest club. South ducked, and West's king won.

West returned his spade, and South ruffed East's ten. Now, when South led the heart queen, West took the king and, instead of making the safe return of the heart six, led back the club nine. This saved South a club trick, and the penalty was only 500 points.

Even if South had gone down the limit, 800 points, East-West would have found that they had sold out too cheaply, because a contract of six diamonds, "their way," would have been ironclad! This brings us to the point of this article—East, void of hearts, should not have considered leaving in the doubles; he should bid three diamonds, and after that, it would not have taken great enterprise to reach a slam.
