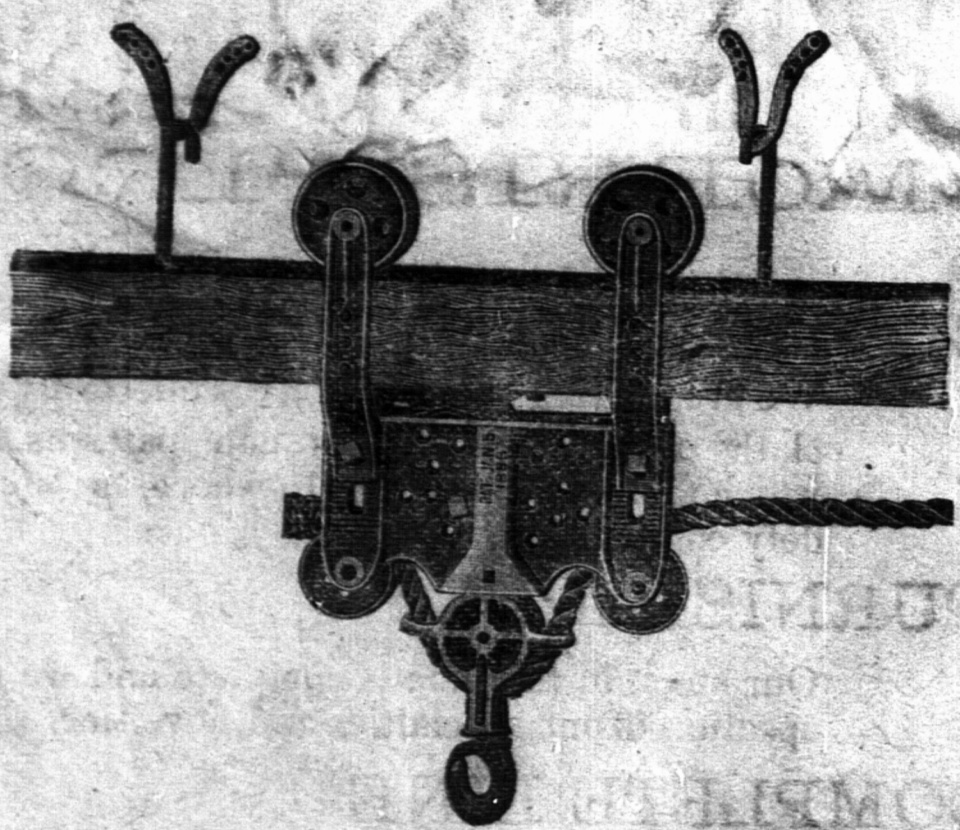

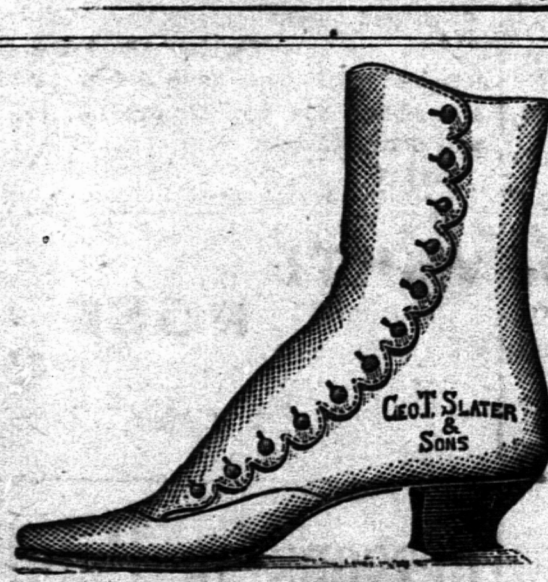

The Second Draft of Station Sheet.

Educational Meeting-A Steamboat Excursion.

The morning session opened Monday June 27th at 9 o'clock. Prayer was offered by Rev. D. Chapman.

Rev. C. H. Paisley presented a report from the committee appointed to consider a document from the Nova Scotia conference.

The unanimous thanks of the conference were tendered the Methodist churches and congregations and others of their friends for the hospitality extended them during their stay in the city.

The meeting closed with the doxology and benediction.

The changes in the sheet published are as follows:-

St John District \$258.43 Frederickton 215.00 Miramichi 85.69 Sackville 255.36 St. Stephen 60.69 P. E. Island 253.49

Total \$1128.43 This shows an increase of \$202.41 on the year.

The following districts have a surplus in their assessment of ten cents per member: St John three cents, Miramichi five dollars and ninety cents, and Sackville forty-one dollars and eighty-five cents.

St John District-Dr Wilson is added as a Supernumerary to Queen Square Church and Dr Pope, Revs H Daniel and H E Narraway to Centenary.

St Stephen District-Rev H A Gillespie is placed for Oldright, and Rev W R Pepper for Deer Island.

The amended sheet will be submitted to the Conference today.

The invitation of the reception committee to enjoy a sail on the river was accepted by the greater part of the members of Conference and a number of their hosts and friends Monday afternoon.

At 4 o'clock the steamer Southport left the ferry wharf. Everything was done by the committee for the comfort and happiness of the guests.

Refreshments were in abundance and several of the lay brethren distinguished themselves by their happy manner of serving them.

Music without which any excursion would be incomplete was provided in the shape of an organ and a phonograph.

Many of the party were fine singers and the hours were passed all too quickly.

The steamer ran in a westerly direction some miles. Many exclamations as to the beauty of the scenery were heard, expressed by the ladies and gentlemen.

The boat returned to the wharf at 6 o'clock and the verdict of all was that a pleasant time had been spent.

To Encourage Dairying.

OTTAWA, June 21.-The agricultural committee to-day recommended to the house that a bonus be granted to assist the establishment of creameries and towards changing in the autumn of the year cheese factories into butter factories in order to encourage and promote winter dairying.

They also recommended that the house make provision for inspection and weighing of cheese at export customs ports, in order to adjust disputes between buyers and sellers.

That in the bill providing for the inspection of apples, a clause be inserted fixing a fee for inspection, the latter clause having been struck out by the senate.

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A Lieut.-Governor's Widow Marries

A Terrible Tragedy.

Stole the Diamonds.

HALIFAX, June 17.-Mrs. McLellan, widow of the late Hon. A. W. McLellan, late Lieut.-Governor of Nova Scotia, was married this morning at Truro to Henry Tupper.

The bride and groom have gone to New York on their wedding tour.

NEW YORK, June 27.-Max Clergan today pleaded guilty in the court of general sessions of indecent assault on 15 year old Sarah Diven and was immediately shot dead by her brother.

MONTREAL, June 26.-When Sir Donald Smith drove the last spike in the Canadian Pacific railway, some years ago, he had magnificent diamond pins made in commemoration of the event, giving on Princess Louise, one to Mrs. Van Horne, and a third to the great Canadian prima donna, Madam Albani.

The other day an engraver named Lemjoe, while at work in Mr. Van Horne's mansion, stole the diamonds and hid them in a box of shoe blacking, where they were found later on.

OTTAWA, June 17.-Intelligence has reached here that Rev. Father Chiquiquy, who had a serious operation performed in Chicago by prominent physicians last March, has quite recovered and is now engaged on a lecturing tour again in the western states.

He had delivered 36 lectures since the operation, and although 63 years of age, is enjoying comparatively good health.

Great demands upon his time are being made for lectures on Roman aggression and influence throughout the continent. He is expected here some time this year.

LONDON, June 23.-When the results of Sunday's elections for municipal officers became generally known a crowd gathered in front of the residence of ex-Prime Minister Crisp, the Liberal leader, who was one of the successful candidates, and gave him an ovation.

The crowd noisily celebrated the Liberal victory, and amid the cheers for the successful candidates "Down with the clericals! Down with the Pope!"

In response to repeated calls Crisp delivered a short speech. Afterward the crowd marched to the palace of the Propaganda, where a demonstration against the clericals was made.
