OUR FRUIT.

Opinion of Mr. Starr, Who Was Judge at the Exhibition.

In summer apples the show is large and fine, although their proper season is past. Astrachan is shown in numbers, well grown and highly colored. Yellow Transparent, several dishes of which were larger and had been finer than any I had ever before seen, were much over-ripe. Sops of Wine and Williams' Favorite are of fair size, good form and highly colored. Fetosky, I am glad to see, is not much grown as it is useless where so much better sorts can be grown successfully.
Autumn apples are shown in quantities, Duchess of Oldenburg leading for quantity, and perfection of growth and color. Some are marked "New Brunswick" and a section of the prize list is open for them. Practically there is no difference between them. Theoretically or scientifically there are grave doubts as to the existence of any such difference as is claimed, and to save complications in the future it would be well to drop the name "New Brunswick" from the prize list.
There are a number of plates of "Alexander," large and handsome; several of "Gravensteins," very good; Fall Jennetings, excellent; Hawthornden Peach and Red Quarrinden are as good as are usually seen on the tables at any of the shows.

EARLY AND LATE WINTER.
The collection of ten or more sorts are, in most instances, very creditable to the exhibitors, those taking first and second prizes especially so, being well selected and for the most part correctly named, and containing a large percentage of standard well-known sorts.

I find a great confusion of names among the winter varieties. Ribston is entered as Roxbury Russet and as Golden Russet, and among a number of varieties entered as R. G. Greening not one was correct; neither were there any Roxbury Russets shown, although there were several varieties of apples entered under that name. As a rule, most of the winter varieties are rather undersized as compared with those grown in the fruit counties of Nova Scotia, the exception being Wealthy and Fameuse, which are well grown, well colored and free from spot or scab. A large, handsome apple, unknown to me, called Winter Bough, of which several plates were shown, seems worthy of further trial. A plate wrongly shown as Wealthy, No. — is a very showy, solid, firm apple, and should be looked after; also a large, fine-looking, high-flavored apple, said to be introduced many years ago by a Mr. Cairns and the name lost. I consider this apple worthy of extended trial, and as it should have a name, would suggest that it be called "Cairns," and that some of your best fruit growers be induced to give it immediate trial by top-grafting on bearing trees.

The show of crab apples is simply magnificent. The number of exhibits, the number of varieties, brilliancy of coloring and size of fruit are remarkable, and excel anything I have seen in the class before.
The exhibit of plums is very good considering the lateness of the show, there being a large competition in Moore's Arctic, Magnum Bonum, Lombard and Damsons, with a number of plates of Victoria, and very fine single plates of Prince Albert, Jefferson, Mitchellson, Bradshaw, Washington, etc.
The show of pears, although small, plainly proves that much more can be done toward supplying your own market with this fine fruit. One plate of Clapp's Favorite, entered as "Bartlett," would be no disgrace to the show tables of the Massachusetts Horticultural Society. Several plates of Flemish Beauty, of fair size, were singularly free from spot or crack and very good samples of Bartlett, Belle Lucrative, Duchesse d'Angouleme, and Louise Bonne de Jersey, were shown.
The show of grapes is poor, probably owing to want of care and skill on the part of growers rather than to climatic influence.
Small fruits in glass.—The show of these, though small, is good, some of the strawberry are immense, one single specimen in a tumbler is the largest I have seen anywhere. Gooseberries are very fine, large and handsome; currants large and well-grown; raspberries good.
Taking it altogether, the show of fruits is one that the Province may well be proud of in the present condition of fruit growing, the farmers having much to learn or in the case, cultivation and selection of varieties suited to the soil and climate.

This is a subject that should engage the attention of the Local Government, and an Experimental Fruit Farm, where all the hardy varieties of fruits should be treated and reported upon, would be of the greatest benefit to the whole agricultural community.
