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George Drew Appointed High Commissioner In London

LONDON (CP)—Canada's Prime Minister Diefenbaker announced at a press conference today that George Drew, former leader of the Progressive Conservative party, has been appointed Canadian high commissioner in London.

The appointment is effective Aug. 1. The post has been vacant since last May 8, when the former high commissioner, Norman Robertson, left to become Canadian ambassador in Washington.

S. D. Pierce, deputy high commissioner, has been acting high commissioner in the interval. Diefenbaker, here for the conference of Commonwealth prime ministers starting Wednesday, made the announcement almost casually at a morning meeting with newspaper men in the seventh-floor suite at the Hotel Dorchester.

The news took the reporters by surprise, though as Diefenbaker jokingly said there has been some recent "authentic conjecture" in Canada about the possibility of Drew's appointment.

FULLY RECOVERED
Drew, 63 and from Guelph, Ont., was premier of Ontario before he took over as national leader of the Progressive Conservative party.

He resigned last year because of bad health, and was succeeded by Diefenbaker, who became prime minister after the party's upset victory in the June 10 election.

Diefenbaker told reporters today that Drew now has fully recovered.

SURVEYS FOR MAPS
OTTAWA (CP)—The mines and technical surveys department says the 76 survey parties it is sending out this year will enable the production of 200 new topographical maps, mainly on the Arctic.

The department also would enable the production of several Arctic improvements maps and the production of 12 new maps of coastal and inland waters.

MORE TOBACCO PRODUCTS
OTTAWA (CP)—Canada's tobacco industry produced \$444,283,000 worth of cigars, cigars, snuff, plug and twist chewing tobacco and other types of products during 1956. The bureau of statistics said Monday. Advance figures indicated a 4.4-per cent increase over the 1955 output of \$316,653,000.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

Opening lead—king of clubs.
An excellent example of planning the play of a hand so as to insure the contract is furnished today. Its character is so unusual that the proper play is not obvious even when all four hands are examined.

Declarer's concern when he first sees dummy is that the heart finesse will lose to East, and that if this takes place his king of diamonds will come under attack and be led to the slaughterhouse.

If he is of a cautious nature, and pessimistically inclined, South will adopt the view that both the king of hearts and ace of diamonds are badly placed. Precedence of his assumption, therefore, declarer will ask himself what he can do about it if this condition exists.

A solution will then appear, after great travail, if he is astute enough to find it. He will make the dummy play on trick number one. On the king of clubs lead he will discard the four of hearts.

This play makes the contract virtually foolproof. No longer does it matter who has the heart king or who has the diamond ace. Assume West continues with the ace of clubs. South ruffs and the queen plays a high trump. The queen plays the ace and is returned. If East has the king and plays it, South ruffs and enters dummy with a trump to discard two diamonds on dummy's good hearts.

Declarer makes five. If West has the king he wins the jack of hearts (his second trick), but he can then do no better than cash his ace of diamonds; in fact, if he doesn't take it, he loses it.

By conceding the opening trick to the enemy, declarer does more than minimize the chance of defeat. He eliminates it.
