

Dick Erla Is Winner Of Free-For-All Event

Keen Competition Is Feature Of Afternoon Race Meet Yesterday

Between three and four thousand people saw more keen racing of a typical Old Home Week variety at the Exhibition Raceway yesterday afternoon when a 10-dash card produced very close racing in an action-packed program that saw four horses set new time records.

Although the time were not particularly fast, the competition was very tight in every class with some of the entries outdoing themselves in the way of individual marks.

Chalking up a new mark of 2:12 2-5 in the eighth dash of the first division classified trot, Bud Kalmuck, owned by J. E. Given of Halifax and driven by A. J. Goulet, trotted the fastest mile of the meet to clip one second off his previous record. Winning the opening dash in the same class, Prairie Pete also set a new mark of 2:13 1-5, two-fifths of a second better than his previous best time.

The other two horses setting new time records were L.L. Frisco and Neil Budlong. Frisco, owned and driven by Don MacNeil of Summerside, clipped two-fifths of a second off her time when she won the opening dash of the card in the third division 2:21-2:24 pace in 2:15 4-5. Neil Budlong, owned by Fred Taylor, Breadalbane, and driven by Joe Hennessy, won the second dash of the second division 2:21-2:24 pace in the time of 2:13 2-5 to shear 1 4-5 seconds off his former record.

Chester Birt's Bonnie Dale, driven by Willard Kelly, was the only consistent winner of the card when she clipped off firsts in both dashes of the second division classified trot for the double win.

Other winning horses were Freddy Scott, Lela Budlong, Captain Missouri and Phil Cobb's Lindy H.

Old Home Week and Provincial Exhibition harness racing is still going strong following the staging of top-notch, early week performances that has given thousands of fans a barrel of thrilling track action and promises plenty more before the massive program comes to a conclusion here Saturday.

Speedy duels over every inch of the mile distance in changing, torrid battles that has seen driver and horse employ the skill and daring of their calling has been a highlight of the meet to date with records falling by the wayside as the program rolls on.

Suffering only one disappointment, Tuesday night's rained out scheduled performance, the program reached a high, mid-week peak here on Wednesday afternoon and evening when crowds totalling upwards of twelve thousand people jammed the stands and grounds for the occasion and were given a wealth of action for their money. Large fields of pacers and trotters roared round the turns and down the stretches in driving contests that produced unexpected upsets and photo finishes and brought the crowd surging to their feet in wild excitement to cheer their favourite horse and driver on to victory.

With the Thursday program ready to commence at time of writing, more sparkling action will be the order of the day that will feature the big free-for-all pace in the evening when Jenny Lyn, Lock Hanover, Dick Erla, Seven-Up Direct, Victory Dale and Cheeky Chief will be coming out on the track to take the word in a contest that rabid rail fans have been waiting to see all week. Record breaking performances in both individual and track departments are anticipated as a result of the big event. Preceded by a promising five-class program in the afternoon, the nightcap free-for-all will be supported by three other divisions for a full day of racing entertainment.

Another big afternoon and evening program today and more scheduled events for tomorrow will bring the week-long racing classic to a thrilling conclusion and add another glowing chapter to Old Home Week and Provincial Exhibition racing history.

As the situation stands at the moment, local baseball enthusiasts will probably see the Curran and Briggs juniors the visiting team here at Memorial Field on Sunday afternoon. Officials are at present negotiating to schedule the event following the temporary breakdown of plans to bring a junior club from Louisville, N.B. here this week-end as the visiting club.

Earlier this week officials had hoped to have the Louisville club here, but information from the mainland club states that they will not be able to keep a scheduled appointment this week but suggested that a home and home series might be arranged during next week. It will not be known until sometime today whether or not the Curran and Briggs team will be here on Sunday, but the possibilities are promising at the moment.

If the clash comes off, it will be the third exhibition meeting between the two Island junior teams this season and should prove an interesting affair. In the first meeting at Summerside the Able crew took a decisive 7-1 verdict from the Western Capital juniors but the return match here saw the visitors reverse the verdict in an equally convincing manner to take the game 6-1. The rubber match should see both clubs come out really belting for a victory that will produce smart ball.

Takes All 3 Dashes Of Feature Race Here Last Night

Witnessed by a huge crowd of approximately eight-thousand racing fans, Norman Acker's Dick Erla, a brown gelding from St. Stephen, N. B., was the big winner of last night's Old Home Week racing feature, the free-for-all pace, when he was guided in to three straight wins by driver R. Creamer. The fastest winning time of the class was 2:08 3-6 in the 9th dash.

Although the border-town pacer was a consistent winner he was pushed hard by powerful last quarter drives by Seven-Up Direct who placed in two of the three dashes, losing out to Erla in driving neck-and-neck battles to the wire. Victory Dale was the leading contender in the middle dash for the second place spot.

In other leading events on the card, Pat Hanover, owned by Roy Bevan of Charlottetown and driven by James McGregor, was a double winner by romping home in front both dashes of the third division classified trot, while Hardroad Bill, owned and driven by Harold Stead, Brackley, clipped off firsts in two of the three dashes in the third division 2:25 pace. Sister Mary, driven by Harvey Cormier and owned by the H. and S. Stables, City, won the other heat.

In the fourth division 2:21-2:24 pace, Bob Canuck upset a seven-horse field in the first dash of the fourth division, 2:21-2:24 pace, while Silver Sis split the honor by taking the second dash of the class.

The old days when scoring with a pole horse was a big feature of racing entertainment, returned to its own during the meet when the mechanical starting gate broke down at the start of the ninth dash and presiding judge Dr. F. G. Dougan had to take over his starting chores of old that gave the crowd an added thrill.

It was a typical return to the old days too, when the horses refused to go away right after five false scoring attempts, and Dr. Dougan's voice could be heard booming out such phrases as "take that horse in hand", or "fit you come down ahead of the pole horse again, it will cost you \$25". And it did cost them \$25 too.

Keen Battles Continue At DCRA Annual Shoot

CONNAUGHT RIFLE RANGES, South March, Ont., Aug. 16—(CP)—Lieut. Gilmore S. BOA, 27-year-old 46th Highlanders officer from Toronto, today won the shoot-off to win the qualifying round of the Governor-General's prize at the 83rd annual Dominion of Canada Rifle Association shoot.

Lieut. Boa, who brought the King's Prize to Canada from Bisley this year for the first time in 22 years, shot five bulls-eyes to CSM. Norm L. Beckett, 42-year-old Royal Hamilton Light Infantry marksman from Hamilton, Ont.

The pair finished the match earlier in the day with a tied score of 149, one off the possible firing 10 rounds from each of the 200, 500 and 600 yard ranges. In the regulation five-round shoot-off, Lieut. Boa and CSM. Beckett were still tied and they had to go into a shot-for-shot competition.

In the first five shots, Lieut. Boa scored four consecutive bulls before he dropped to an inner four on his fifth. CSM. Beckett fired a bull on his first, dropped to an inner on his second and then fired three more bulls.

In the shot-for-shot competition, Lieut. Boa fired first and the white flag appeared, scoring it as a bull. The CSM. Beckett aimed and fired an inner four to stop the duel.

A four-man Ottawa army headquarters team earlier won the Coates Match, posting a score of 391 of a possible 400 from 500 and 600 yards to beat out teams from the Queen's Own Rifles "B" team, Toronto, second with 386, and the New Westminster Regiment, third with 366.

all four entries came down ahead of the pole horse, Seven-Up Direct driven by Lloyd Walker, and all four drivers had to come down from their gulkies and pay up before the race was resumed.
