Barbara Ann Scott Said Engaged To Tommy King

CHICAGO (CP)—Barbara Ann Scott is going to be married. The Hollywood, Ice Revue announced Friday that the 27-year-old petite former Olympic, world and European champion figure skater will marry Tommy King, publicity director for Chicago Stadium sports enterprises.

The couple are on their way to Toronto, where a formal announcement is expected shortly, possibly Tuesday.

Earlier, Barbara Ann refused to talk to reporters. King's only comment was that "Barbara Ann and I have been very good friends for four years."

YEAR'S LEAVE FOR GROOM

The couple had dinner Thursday night at the farm of Arthur Wirtz, promoter of the Hollywood Ice Revue. A friend of Barbara Ann's said Wirtz gave the couple his blessing and told King to take a year's leave of absence from his job so they could be together.

Ludols Kassebaum, manager of the ice revue, denied Barbara Ann had been "dropped" from this year's show.

"We can't stand in the way of love," he said.

Barbara Ann and King are said to be keen on settling down and raising a family in Canada but before the Ottawa-born skater retires permanently she expects to make a "farewell" tour of Canadian towns and cities.

DIVORCED, FATHER OF TWO
King, divorced and father of two children, Shelley, 5, and Thomas, 3, is son of Tom King, Sr., dean of men students at Michigan State University.

He starred on the University of Michigan basketball team and after graduation in 1947 played professional basketball with Detroit Falcons. He joined James Morris Enterprises in Chicago in 1948.

"If a girl gets married," she said, "she should look after her husband and her home and not go dashing around all over the place."

Barbara Ann's skating career is one list of successes.

In 1947 she won the women's European figure skating championship and two weeks later the world championship at Stockholm. She retained her European crown the following year in Prague.

The same year she reached the pinnacle of her amateur career, winning the Olympic Games title. She turned professional soon afterward.
