CHANGE IN STAMPS. — Considerable changes are being made in the color of Canada postage stamps. As soon as the present supply of purple two cent stamps at Ottawa is exhausted, which will probably be today, no more will be issued, but the same stamp will be issued in red, the color prescribed by the Universal Postal Union. But before these are issued a number of red three cent stamps, now in the possession of the Post Office Department will be surcharged down to two cents. It is hardly likely however that any of these will ever see P. E. Island, and it will probably be some time before any of the red two cent stamps come down.

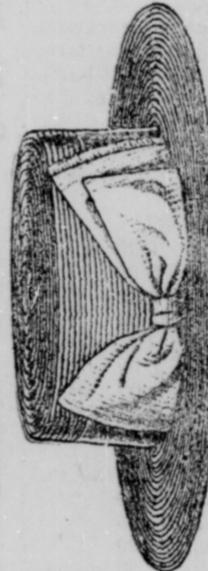

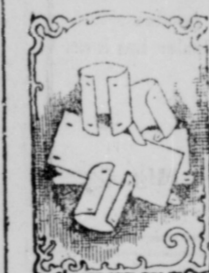

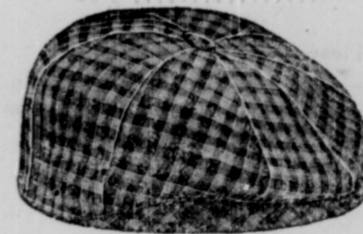
