Night Kite Flying.

In using the phosphorus, however,
be very careful, as it is chemical. If
you fly the new box kites, a very pretty
effect can be obtained by hanging a
little Chinese lantern to each corner
and also along the string with which
you hold it. As the box kite is very
steady, there is comparatively little
danger of your lanterns being blown
out, and the appearance of these many
twinkling colored lights high up in the
air is very beautiful.

are very peaceful and docile when
brought in contact with man.

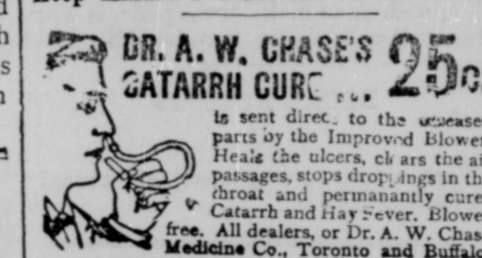
