Well-Known S'side Businessman Dies

SUMMERSIDE — Lucas Roy Allen, one of Summerside's and the Province's best remembered citizens, died yesterday at the age of 68.

Known most in the business world as the president of Bruce, MacKay and Company Limited, Mr. Allen began work with the firm in 1934 when he delivered groceries.

He was also a Director of Northumberland Ferries Limited until his death, and was closely connected with the Island's silver fox industry and the Legislative Assembly in 1927 and was re-elected in 1931 and 1935. He was a member of both the Leo and Campbell governments. He had also been a member of Summerside and Provincial Boards of Trade and was a member of the board of trustees for the Prince County Hospital, and as a hobby practiced amateur photography. He was a member of several organizations including: the Masonic Lodge, Loyall Orange Lodge, Knights of Pythias and the Y's Men's Club.

Active in both civic and municipal politics, Mr. Allen was elected to the Legislative Assembly in 1927 and was re-elected in 1931 and 1935. He was a member of both the Leo and Campbell governments. He had also been a member of Summerside and Provincial Boards of Trade and was a member of the board of trustees for the Prince County Hospital, and as a hobby practiced amateur photography. He was a member of several organizations including: the Masonic Lodge, Loyall Orange Lodge, Knights of Pythias and the Y's Men's Club.

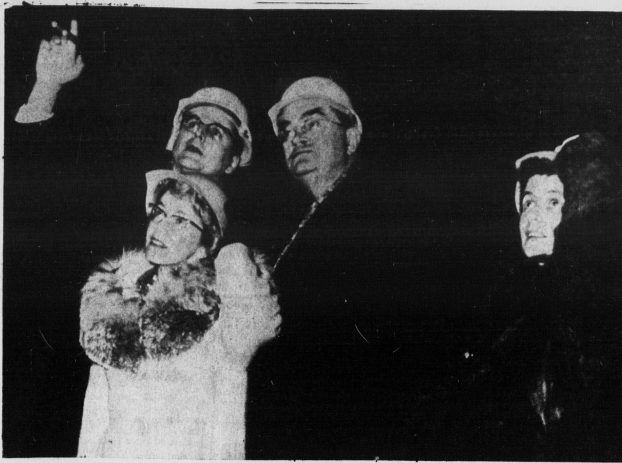

He didn't want the Senate to repeat last week's experience of assembling every day waiting for a supply bill which didn't come.

"We are playing the same game all over again, off again, think it wrong to think of a senatorship as a job and wrong to think of the Senate as a place where people are supposed to work. Pensions aren't given for work, but for a job."

Senator C. G. Power (L-Quebec) said there is no urgency for the Senate to pass the estimates as long as they are approved before the end of April. He proposed a two-week adjournment. Several other senators supported the idea.

Senator O'Leary's criticism of the bill since it was returning contributions by workers.

He said the senator's action prompted Mr. Knowles' bill. "Maybe he is trying to throw the baby out with the bath water."

MOSCOW (AP)—The Soviet government newspaper Pravda accused the Red Chinese Tuesday of "putting into practice the split in the Communist movement."

It was the first official open implication that split had already occurred although privately many party officials have indicated it was inevitable—and many have said it already exists.

The statement was contained in an editorial of the paper, which is edited by Alexei Adzhubel, son-in-law of Premier Khrushchev.

The paper accused the Chinese government newspaper Marxism-Leninism as interpreted by the Russians, and of substituting "Marxism" after Mao Tse-tung, Chinese party leader.

"They not only demand that all fraternal parties submit to this Chinese Marxism," the paper said, "they are propagandizing and are practically putting into practice the split in the Communist movement and separate parties."

Echoing a charge repeatedly by the Chinese, the news paper accused the Chinese of "fencing off" their people from the Soviets.

Snow Tuesday Is Short Lived
