**CLARE ATTACK ON JEWS.**

**Cardinal Vaughan Seeks Papal Intervention.**

Rome, Dec. 30.—Monsignor Merry del Val, the Papal chamberlain, has received from Cardinal Vaughan a note requesting that the Pope be informed that in his Emancipation's judgment the Papacy is being injured by the unjustified attacks upon the Jews which appeared in the Vatican press. Cardinal Vaughan takes especial exceptions to the eagerness with which certain journals have seized upon the charge that Christian children have been murdered by Jews in course of ritualistic observances. He also urges upon the Holy See the necessity of immediate reform in the conduct of a press which he believes works damage to Catholicity.

**MR. TARTE HOLDS ON.**

To the report that Mr. Tarte means to resign there is an emphatic denial from Ottawa.

Like Sir Wilfrid Laurier, Mr. Tarte does not believe in resigning merely because he has taken a public and positive stand at variance with the unanimous sense of the country on an important question.

To the sending of troops to South Africa both the real and the titular master of the Administration declared themselves opposed.

But when Canada put down her foot and said the men must go, both these amusing administrators dropped their quills and hastened to despatch contingent No 1.

Neither of them resigned, though they were thus made to do what they declared themselves against doing.

And now, when the second contingent is being prepared, both Sir Wilfrid and Mr. Tarte again swallow their amour propre, hang on to office, and hasten to carry out the wishes of the people.—Mail and Empire.
