## Farm Homemakers List Sweet Potato Recipes

In New Jersey, whenever we stopped to visit a farm homemaker, we asked how she used sweet potatoes.

Here are some of the suggestions they made:  
Candy as usual, but add grated orange peel to the syrup.  
French-fry as you would white potatoes.  
Serve mashed, plain or with chopped raisins or nutsmeats beaten.

Pan-fry whole cooked sweet potatoes in bacon fat and serve with bacon for breakfast.  
Add equal parts diced sweet and white potatoes to meat stew for fine flavor.

NEWS SPREADS FAST  
We stopped at the home of sweet-potato grower, Leslie Richards, near Pitman, New Jersey, but nobody was there. However, news of our tour and visits had evidently spread fast. Inside the screen door, was tucked a note addressed to me.

"Dear Mrs. Allen," it read "I had to take my grandchild in the doctor. In case you call, here is my favorite casserole dish. Regards, Mrs. Leslie Richards."

You will like the recipe from this thoughtful woman.  
Stuffed Chopped Beef Casserole (Mrs. Leslie Richards): Pour 1/2 can condensed tomato soup into a casserole. Top with 1/2 lb. chopped beef.  
Small-dice 1/2 loaf bread. Mix in 1 minced onion, 1 tsp. minced celery, 1 egg, 3/4 c. water, 1/2 tsp. salt and 1/4 tsp. pepper. Spread in the casserole.  
Then spread in 1/2 lb. additional chopped beef and pour in the remaining 1/2 can soup.  
Bake 40 min. in a moderate oven, 375 degrees F. Uncover and brown.  
Monday Oven-Dinner: Cucum-

ber beet salad; casserole of stuffed chopped meat; baked sweet potatoes; escalloped spinach; fresh fruits-in-gel; coffee, tea or milk.  
Sweet Potato Cookies from the Chef:  
I have invented a new sweet potato cookie, dedicated to all those who like to dunk. Better make two times the recipe and freeze half of them for future enjoyment.  
Sweet Potato Cookies: Into a bowl, sift together 2 c. already sifted enriched flour, 2 tsp. baking powder, 1/4 tsp. baking soda, 1/2 tsp. salt, 1 tsp. cinnamon, 1/4 tsp. ginger, 1/4 tsp. nutmeg and 1/4 tsp. allspice. Add 1-1 1/2 c. brown sugar.  
Mix in 2-3 c. soft shortening, 2 eggs and 1 c. mashed sweet potato. Beat until smooth, about 2 min.  
Blend in 2 c. uncooked quick or old-fashioned rolled oats.  
Drop by rounded tablespoons onto an oiled cookie sheet. Bake in a moderate oven, 375 degrees F. for 12 to 15 min. Cool and dust with cinnamon-sugar. Makes 4 doz.

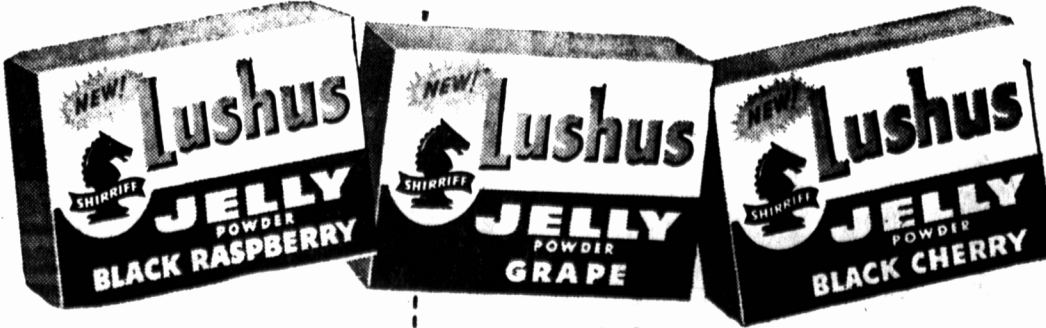
