OBITUARY
Inscribed by the family.
MRS. MALCOLM D. MARTIN
The community of Valleyfield and surrounding area, as well as her family, relatives and friends were saddened on Friday, January 31, 1964, at the death of Mrs. Malcolm D. Martin, in the Kings County Memorial Hospital, Montserrat.
Although in her eighty-seventh year, she continued remarkably active and alert, and had only entered the hospital a few days previous to her death.
The late Mrs. Martin, born in Glen Martin, P.E.I., was the daughter of Kenneth Martin and his wife Mary Bruce Martin. Before her marriage she spent some years in Boston, Massachusetts. She married Malcolm D. Martin in 1902. For the past sixty years she has resided in Valleyfield, where her neighbors now keenly feel the loss of one of their senior citizens, who lived for so many years and was a good neighbor in their midst. Many relatives and friends through the years shared the friendly hospitality of her home, where they were always welcome, and she was a busy one at home, community, and church. She was a good homemaker, mother, and friend, and was and is sorely missed by her children and grandchildren.
Mrs. Martin was a faithful member of Valleyfield Church, which she generously supported, and which she attended regularly until the last year or two, when due to the infirmities of old age she became more and more confined to her home. In her concern for the spiritual life of people, she encouraged her family to the same generous support, attendance, and participation in any church activity.
She was an active member of the Ladies Aid Society, the Women's Missionary Society, and a charter member of both. She was also a member of the W.M.S. and until recent years missed very few meetings.
She was a member of the Women's Institute Branch in the district, and continued her interest in it, and was always ready to help in any way she could.
During her declining years her needs were kindly considered by her son and daughter-in-law and family who lived in the home with her.
She was preceded by her husband, who passed away five years ago, and by their daughter, who died in nineteen-thirty.
Left to mourn a loving mother are one daughter, Mrs. Mary Mrs. Art Burns, Charlottetown, and six sons, as well as 18 grand-children, besides nieces and nephews. She was good to them all, and they made her life happy by their frequent visits and thoughtful remembrances.
The sons are: Malcolm D. Martin, Charlottetown; Angus, at home; Charles, Sackville; Callum, Bellevue; Allan in Charlottetown.
Of a large family of sisters and brothers, only two remain, Marjorie, Mrs. John Alex MacPherson, Toronto, Ont., lives to mourn the loss of a daughter.
The funeral service, which was largely attended, was held in the alleyfield Church on Sunday, February 2, and was conducted by her pastor, Rev. G.M. Fraser, assisted by Rev. Carl Currie. Funeral arrangements were under the direction of the Montague Funeral Home. With Mrs. P. Pearson, organist, and the Valleyfield Choir, the hymns sung were: "The Lord's My Shepherd"; "O God, Our Help in Ages Past"; "The Brooklyn Trio sang "The Christians Goodnight".
Interment was in the Valleyfield cemetery, with committal service by Rev. G. Fraser.
