

Ontario Education Dept. Has Youth Branch Formed

TOBACCO (CP) — Education Minister William Davis of Ontario has announced the establishment of a youth branch in his department to seek solutions to the problems of teaching, training and the use of leisure.

The department will co-ordinate the efforts of voluntary and government agencies and will teach youth how "to be happily useful and privately happy," Mr. Davis said.

53 Oil Companies Co-operate In Boost Sask. Field Output

WYBURN, Sask. (CP) — More than 50 oil companies working in the new Wyburn oil field are operating in the formation of the largest flood-water project in North America.

Increased from 13 per cent to 32 per cent and can add 20 years to the life of the field. Water forced into the well increasing the pressure in the basin for easier recovery.

Bad Williams, field superintendent of Central Del Rio Oils Ltd., which operates the field, said Del Rio is representing the 53 oil companies with interests in the oil producing areas, about 60 miles southeast of Regina. Del Rio is installing 200 miles of pipeline and 17 displacement pumps to force water into oil wells.

When completed, the operation will handle 225,000 barrels of oil daily—60,000 barrels of oil and 160,000 to 175,000 barrels of water.

FALMOUTH, ENGLAND (AP) — Two men were charged here with killing a man who had been reported dead since 1918.

Police identified them as Russell Parsons, 33, and Dennis John White, 22. They are charged with murder and with aiding a victim.

The victim was William Garfield Rowe, a 64-year-old father of four, who died of a heart attack at a lonely farm last Wednesday.

To all but his father, mother and two brothers, Rowe died in 1918. His family spread the story that he was killed in the First World War to cover up the fact that he was an army deserter in hiding. After the war the pretence was continued.
