**NEWSPAPER IN TROUBLE.**—The Detroit Free Press has libel suits filed against it for damages amounting to \$525,000, for its utterances in connection with the passage of a bill providing for the ownership of municipal railways.

**DIDN'T WAIT LONG.**—About three weeks ago we published the death of a lady at Upper Branch. On Saturday last the bereaved husband took unto himself another spouse. The bride has already been four times a widow, and this is the groom's third venture at matrimony.—Bridgewater Enterprise.

**GOOD ONES.**—Mr John Richards, Bideford, received Thursday night, by the Northumberland, two yearling ewe lambs, from Altamont Stock Farm, Millbrook, Dutchess County, New York, the greatest prize winning Shropshire flock in America. They are certainly splendid specimens of the best type of this breed.—Summerside Agriculturist.

**THE CANADIAN CONTINGENT.**—Some facts in connection with the outfit of the Canadian Contingent may prove of interest. There were 7,000 yards of "khaki" and 12,000 yards of serge cut up for clothing for the 1,000 men, by Workman, of Montreal, and Sanford, of Hamilton. The former made 1,500 pairs of khaki or duck trousers, while the latter turned out 1,500 jackets of this material and 3,000 pairs of trousers. This provides 4,500 complete suits for officers and men.

**OUT OF BUSINESS.**—The Victuallers Association of Westmoreland held a meeting yesterday and decided to discontinue business, and to ship all stocks of liquors back to the wholesale dealers in St. John. If this decision should be acted upon generally Moncton is like to become a Scott Act town in the strictest sense of the word. It is reported the temperance people of Sackville have raised \$1,000 and have pledged themselves to suppress the sale of liquor in that end of the county.—Moncton Times.

**A GREAT CATHEDRAL.**—The Cathedral of St John the Divine, which is now being erected by the Protestant Episcopalians, on Morningside Heights, N. Y., when completed will be one of the finest religious structures on the Continent. The ground cost \$250,000, the foundation for the choir, \$250,000 more, and the choir, when completed will seat 2,500 worshippers, and will be the largest religious gathering place in New York. The Cathedral complete will cost \$10,000,000, and will be supplemented by a Bishop's palace.
