It has arrayed against it some of the forces that in the past united under the Liberal banner, but which are now broken up into three separate groups, viz: Liberal, Farmer, Labor. In 1912 the Liberal regime came to an end, and subsequent events have BROKEN UP EVERY LINK OF COHESION THAT UNITED THE VARIOUS PROGRESSIVE ELEMENTS TO LIBERALISM. Liberalism, therefore has suffered worse by the CHANGE THAT HAS TAKEN PLACE IN MEN'S MINDS throughout Canada than has Conservatism.

This is not the utterance of a government paper or one supporting the Meighen administration but the lament of a leading Liberal party, deploring what it regrets to be the real situation, but too honest to conceal the truth from its readers.

Then the Whig goes further. Referring to its party, it says: "The moment it becomes inactive, and disorganized, it fails, because its success is just in proportion to the ability of its leaders, and what the party wants today IS ACTIVE LEADERS. IT LOST ITS LEADERSHIP when the coalition was formed, and to this must be attributed the offshoots from the party, represented by labor and the farmers.
