Over 10,000 Hungarian Refugees Coming This Year

OTTAWA (CP)—Between 10,000 and 12,000 Hungarian refugees are expected to arrive in Canada by plane and ship by the end of January, an immigration department official said Tuesday.

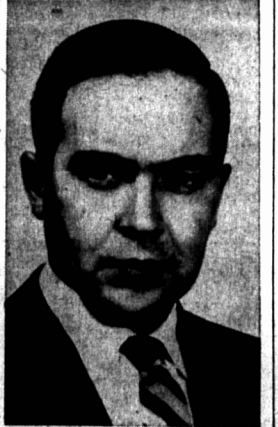
The department official said the government is chartering every available Canadian aircraft to transport Hungarian refugees to this country.

Firemen searched the ruins for more bodies. Police said one guest in the 45-room British Exchange Hotel is believed missing. They said two of the victims are believed to be sailors.

Cities Asked To Aid Refugees
