UNITED States greenbacks being now about as good as gold, the Canadian Customs discount on American invoices has been abolished.
THE brigantine "Fleetwood," English, master, arrived from Barbadoes yesterday, with a cargo of molasses, sugar, etc., to Longworth and Co.

THE monthly police inspection of the police force was held before the Stipendiary Magistrate this morning. It was followed by a lengthy lecture.
THE Steam Navigation Co. steamers sailed for Port Hawkesbury and Shediac this morning. They will call at Pictou and Summerside on their return.

LAUNCHED, on the 23rd ult., from the shipyard of J. R. Bourke, Mount Stewart, a well-finished schooner of 85 tons, named The Lillian Bourke. The above schooner is now taking in a cargo for the Newfoundland market.

At the Stipendiary Magistrate's Court this morning, Thomas Sweeney, drunk and disorderly on the streets, was fined \$2 and costs or eight days. Anthony Andrews, drunk and disorderly, on complaint of Captain Lane, was discharged.

A row occurred on board the barque Isabella on Saturday night. A Norwegian sailor named Andrews, who wielded a belaying pin without mercy during the affray, was arrested. He appeared before the Magistrate this morning. There being no plaintiff he was discharged.

An elopement took place from Malpeque Road on Sunday morning. At an early hour, a girl named Campbell, residing with her aunt at the above named place, left in a very mysterious manner in company with a servant man named Wilson. Miss Campbell is a girl of fifteen summers, while Mr. Wilson is six or seven summers older. They were pursued very closely on departure by a cousin of Miss Campbell's, but left his sight at the borders of this city. On his arrival, enquiries were made at all quarters, but he failed to discover their whereabouts. He acquainted the police of this matter, and all on duty went immediately on their trail. A watch was placed at the steamers, which were to leave this morning, and all crafts capable of carrying a female passenger were searched. The Provincial Secretary's Office is strictly watched. No marriage license has yet been issued, and all J. P.'s and P.'s are warned not to perform the marriage ceremony. Nothing has yet been heard of them. They will, no doubt, have to turn homewards, as all attempts at wedlock have been foiled.

ONE Mr. C. W. Nimms was billed to hold forth on "Temperance," under the auspices of the Reform Club, on Saturday evening. He did not; and his non-appearance at the Hall is thus accounted for: Mr. Nimms, who represents a Pottery in North Cambridge, Mass., arrived in this City on Saturday at noon. At the Railway Station he met the President of the Reform Club, who was very happy to see him, displayed a large portion of blue ribbon and made anxious enquiries regarding the progress of the Reform Club. Indeed, so anxious was he for the Club's welfare, that he requested to be allowed to address its members. Hence, Mr. Nimms was posted to lecture, under the auspices of the Reform Club, on Saturday evening. At 8 o'clock a large audience congregated in the Reform Club Hall. They remained until a quarter past eight - but no Mr. Nimms appeared. At twenty minutes past eight the President was about to dismiss the audience, when a message was received from Mr. Nimms, who was at the time waiting in the Post Office, which stated: "As soon as I will get my mail matter, I will attend at the Hall." On the receipt of the message, the President was so disgusted that he immediately dismissed the audience, and, on the arrival of Mr. Nimms, which was half an hour afterwards, he ordered that the "gas be extinguished."

NEWS BY TELEGRAPH.

Special Despatch to Daily Examiner. LONDON, May 4. The British Admiralty have ordered the Islands of Haligoland to be fortified, in order to protect English interests in the North Sea. A large number of heavy guns and torpedoes will be sent there. There is no abatement of pressure on the Government works. The activity which prevails in every department cannot be expressed in detail, being created by general demands for munitions, stores, &c. The first issue of preserved meat and biscuit to the troops at Woolwich, in the place of ordinary rations, were made to-day. This has been done to accustom them to fare which will, in the case of war, become daily food.

BUCHAREST, May 5. It is understood that Russia has proposed a new military convention, by which she will be empowered to construct camps at Plofesti and Fakeschain, in return to remove their headquarters and other establishments connected with troops from Bucharest.

ROMANIA, up to the present, has refused its assent. ST. PETERSBURG, May 5. The Turks have evacuated Avtair in the Pashalia of Trebizand. This is looked upon as the commencement of the execution of the Treaty of San Stefano.

THE Agence Russe says "That much better impressions prevail respecting the prospect of negotiations, the rumored approaching arrival of Count Schowaloff here on a visit is connected with the friendly exchange of views resulting from the pour parlers between London and St. Petersburg."

CONSTANTINOPLE, May 5. A portion of the Russians at San Stefano have withdrawn to Hadenkaï.

THE Russo-Turkish convention have concluded arranging for the return of Turkish refugees to their homes. Only those will be sent back at present who belong to localities occupied by the Russians outside of the principality of Bulgaria.

Russian troops will accompany the refugees to protect them and restore their property. QUEBEC, May 4.

The returning officer has given his vote in favor of Hon. A. Chauveau, in Rimouski; he is Mr. Joly's Solicitor General.
