Markets

New York Stocks

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market surged ahead last week with a final explosive rise that shot prices into the old 1929 peaks. All week stocks continued stepping ahead from one record to another despite the holiday-shortened market.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks on the week was up \$3.80 at \$147.50. At that point it stood at the highest mark since Oct. 11, 1929, when it was at \$147.90 thus the average currently is only a little more than \$10 away from the historic peak of \$157.70 reached on Sept. 3, 1929.

For more than 14 months the stock market has been advancing with occasional reactions to consolidate its gains. For about five weeks before the U. S. elections Nov. 2, the market hesitated in a long backing and filling movement.

GAINED STRENGTH

In the week of the election the market displayed its greatest strength. The following week it was almost as strong. Then it faltered.

But last week the market again surged ahead strongly. The five most active issues last week on the New York stock exchange were Sunray Oil up 2 1/2 at 21 1/2 on 206,900 shares, New York Central up 1 1/2 at 25 1/2, Allegheny Corp. up 1 1/2 at 5 1/2, Standard Oil (NJ) up 7/8 at 107 1/2, and Graham-Paige up 3/4 at 2.

Canadian stocks were mixed at week's end. McIntyre gained 1/4 at 67, Canadian Pacific added 1/4 and International Nickel climbed 1/4. Distillers Seagram and Iliam Walker were both off 1/4 and Dome Mines dropped 1/4.

On the American stock exchange Lake Shore was ahead 1/4, Royalite Oil gained 1/4 and Giant Yellowknife remained unchanged.

U. S. Steel

CLEVELAND (AP)—The 79.5 per cent of capacity at which steel was made last week is not far below normal in an average peacetime year. Steel magazine Sunday quotes Benjamin F. Fairless as saying:

"The chairman of U. S. Steel Corp. in the weekly review of the national magazine of metalworking explains:

"Even during World War II, when it was breaking its neck to produce every pound of steel that it could, the average operating rate for the industry was just 94 per cent of capacity. And the average annual production was 86 million tons, which is almost exactly the same amount as the industry expects to turn out this year."

As the ingot output for 1954 continued its steady climb from last

July's level by moving up another half point, Fairless predicted the improvement in the steel business would mean better business for everyone.

He pointed out that every time the steel industry makes and sells 1,000,000 tons of finished steel some 5,000,000 tons of freight must be hauled to and from the steel mills.

If steel usage remains steady, mills will turn out 7,800,000 more tons next year than they did this year. Steel says, and that will mean 40,000,000 more tons of freight haulage to and from steel mills.

Churchill Is Confident Of World's Future

BRISTOL, England, (Reuters)—Prime Minister Churchill Friday expressed confidence in the world's future so long as the English-speaking nations work "courageously and calmly" together.

Churchill, who has been chancellor of Bristol University for 25 years, was addressing 2,000 students in the same hall where he spoke the morning after it was blitzed in the Second World War.

He told the cheering students: "Today we have the measureless advantage denied us after the First World War that the United States is our principal champion and a member of the United Nations organization. Had that happened 20 years before, we might indeed have had a very different story to tell."

"If the English-speaking world—I do not use that expression in an exclusive sense but only because it gives one a feeling of strength and hope for the future—if all the countries who speak our language and share our history and evolved together by our law and literature, if they all walk courageously and calmly along the path of life and destiny, I believe they will be able to save themselves and save the world and the freedom and justice without which human life would indeed be a degradation."

He said the world faces the choice of employing science to open new vistas of peaceful prosperity or of a "situation in which all will collapse in hatred and confusion and might end in obliteration."

OTTAWA (CP)—Navigation on St. Lawrence river canals has been extended a week to Dec. 11 to allow more grain movements from the Lakehead to Montreal, the transport department said Wednesday night.
