

That Christmas Money.

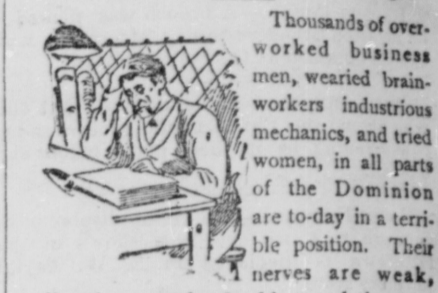
