college dining hall.
Felicity's identity remained gal-
lantly concealed until Tuesday
Her host, Jeremy Rundell, had been
suspended by Oxford University
authorities for having an unidenti-
fied woman in this all-male college
after 7 p.m. But gossip caught up
with her, and university officials
ruled the co-ed should share Run-
dell's fate and be sent home for
the rest of the term.
For her escapade she donned
slacks and used eye-shadow on her
chin to give it "five o'clock sha-
dow." She is a student in one
of the university's all-female col-
leges.

that her dinner table neighbors re-

Thoughts For Our Time

The notion that man in this life
is to find holiness in the fulfill-
ment of God's will, is a familiar
one to the Christian. Yet, often
enough we really fail to grasp the
meaning of this, we fail to see the
whole of God's will in terms of
daily life. The "will of God" so
often becomes a phrase associated
with moments of tragedy—a sort
of formula used at the time of
death or great suffering.
The "seeing" of God's will at
these moments is, of course, a
true insight into reality; but it
must not be limited only to
these occasions. The Divine Will,
this loving presence of God, is
not only to be sought and found
in moments of great sorrow. It
is hidden somehow, often mys-
teriously, within each moment
and experience of human life,
waiting to be discovered—in the
Commandments of God, in the
duties of our vocation or state in
life, in human love and family
life, in our work and recreation,
in our joy and happiness, as well
as in our pain and loneliness and
sorrow.
God does not, it is true, directly
cause everything that enters into
human life, but all things are at
least permitted by Him in view of
some good; and it is in these
things and people that make up
the "atmosphere," as it were, of
our lives, that we can find Him
and His love. And when we have
found this, we have found all.
The longing for peace, for some
sort of stability and security, is
an instinctive thing for most men.
Very often, however, people are
betrayed by what they seek for in
quest of peace and fulfillment.
For some, the idea of peace con-
sists in a negative thing, in an
absence of disturbance and trouble
and worry. For others, peace con-
sists in the possession of certain
material goods—pleasure, power
and wealth. They are restless until
they have these things, and his-
tory is there to assure us that very
often, they are equally restless
after they have them.
The fact is, of course, that in
none of these things, can we find
a deeply satisfying peace for the
human soul. We cannot, in the
first place, make ourselves im-
mune from all worries and
troubles while we live on this
earth—at times they flood in on
us like a tidal wave. Nor can we,
secondly, guarantee that when we
do possess power and wealth, we
shall keep them. Material things

can be destroyed, they may vanish
from our grasp in a hundred dif-
ferent ways; and if they do not,
this at least is certain, that death
shall part us from them. This
knowledge of the essentially tran-
sitory nature of material posses-
sions must inevitably mix a note
of uncertainty into whatever sat-
isfaction that may derive from
them.
The truth is that there is no
absolutely complete peace and ful-
fillment to be had on this earth.
We have been made for the com-
plete possession of God and we
shall rest perfectly only in that
fullness of the vision and love of
God which is eternal life. Yet the
fact remains that even as eternal
life has its beginnings on earth
in the life of grace, so too does
the peace and joy of eternity
have its imperfect commencement
in human life.
This peace—the peace of Christ
—is something interior to man, a
joy and harmony at the centre of
his being, possible even in the
midst of suffering and pain. It is
a thing based not on possessive-
ness, but on love—on a seeking for
God and His will in all the cir-
cumstances of life—in its sor-
row as well as in its laughter. Love
is a fruit of supernatural grace.
This peace exists in the peace of
the pain of the Cross, as well as
in the joy of the Resurrection.
God's will, and with it His love,
are to be found in the cross as in
the other; and it is for each man
to learn in humility and awe, to
receive God's love from all things.
