## 168 Prisoners Are Pardoned By De Gaulle

PARIS (Reuters) - President De Gaulle has pardoned 168 political prisoners serving prison sentences for subversive activities.

Most of them were sentenced in connection with the Secret Army Organization's last stand against Algerian independence in 1962.

The French president also reduced the sentences of 35 others in the customary Christmas amnesties. No names were published.

The announcement gave no numbers of the prisoners being released or those held.

## Wells Among Indian Needs

TORONTO (CP) - After 11 Christmas in India, Dr. Edwin Abbott and his family had only two immediate wishes: A white Christmas and an experienced well-driller willing to travel.

Dr. Abbott, his wife Vivian and their five children have just returned from India where they were medical missionaries under the sponsorship of the Canadian Friends Service Committee, which supplied them with a \$2,000-a-year subsistence allowance.

The committee is a Quaker group concentrating on the problems of feeding the world's poor.

The Abbots, both medical doctors, want a well-driller to go to India because wells are urgently needed there and drillers are rare.

Dr. Abbott said "the rains-failed in India this year and there will be a bad famine next year. The Indians have equipment to drill the needed wells but they don't know how to use it."

They intend to remain in Canada and to work in the public health field.
