## RENT CONTROL

Let's get this project in gear before it's too late. As the landlords and landladies have gotten rich and fat enough off us for quite a few years now. What gives them the right to charge us \$85. to \$135. a month for rent? I'll tell you. We do. Because we are too scared to stand up for our rights. This is why they are rich and we are poor. It will always remain the same unless we stand up and fight!

The following are a few suggestions of mine as to what can be done. If you have any yourself, for God's sake state your piece. We are going to have to work together in this fight if anything

is going to happen, so let's hear from you.

A commission set up to check:

- a) Types of housing supplied by landlords;
- b) investigate the housing situation;
- c) Investigate the condition of the house:
  - 1) fire escapes
  - 2) types of heating
  - 3) cost of heating per month (proof)
  - 4) whether the house is infested with; bed bugs, cockroaches, rats mice, etc.
  - 5) Does the landlord provide a place for you to put your garbage or do you have to keep it in the house until the garbage collector comes.
- d) A maximum amount of money for the type of apartment or house.

We will have to set up a committee to represent us and concentrate on stopping this ridiculous rent race; I repeat rent race for the bene-

fit of the poor.
