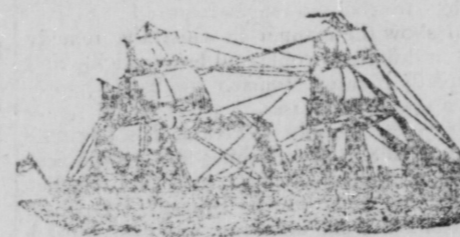

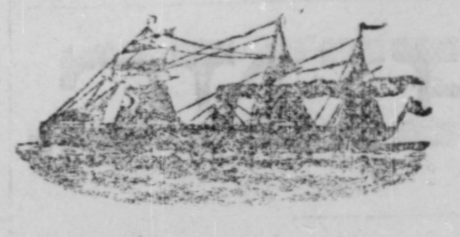

DAIRY PRODUCE.

Cheese Firm With Steady Purchasing--Butter Dull.

Cheese was steady in Montreal this week. There have been some extensive deals put through in the country at a pretty full price, though the exact figure is not named. On spot 2,000 boxes of the tail end of the season from down the river sold at 8 1/2c, which is a pretty full figure considering the quality of the goods.

Brockville, Ont., Nov. 14.—On Saturday last Hodgson Bros' local agent completed a deal whereby that firm purchased a greater part of the balance of the make of cheese in Perth district. He secured W. A. Moore's 22 factories, and also Cavanagh's combination at a figure which has not been learned here. They practically closed out the season's business in the Perth district.

CHARLOTTETOWN MARKETS

An Advance in Oats and a Drop in Pork and Live Hogs.

The shipment of produce is fairly active for the time of year, and it is expected that the movement will be livelier later on.

Since our last report the price of oats has advanced a peg, and they now change hands at 31c.

There is no change to note in the price of potatoes, 25c being all that is given by the buyers.

The price of eggs is also at a standstill, 12 1/2c being the figure. The receipts are becoming smaller as the season advances. It is thought that not more than 1500 boxes have been shipped since our last report. The shipments have been to the Provincial and English markets.

Pork by the carcass brings from 4 1/2 to 4 3/4, a slight falling off in price.

A further drop is reported in the price of live hogs, 3 1/2c being what is given for heavy fats and bacon by Mr Rattenbury.

Advance of Prices in London

Cattle shippers who were fortunate enough to have cattle at London this week will make a very nice profit out of them. Cables from London quote choice American cattle at 12s, choice Canadian at 11s and Argentine at 10 1/2s. Canadian sheep were 11 1/2c. Liverpool quotations were not

LIVE HOGS.

Montreal Market Firm - Chicago Weaker.

The Montreal Star reports: Receipts are not very heavy by rail and the market is firm, \$4.25 to \$4.35 per hundred pounds being paid off the cars this morning.

Chicago quotations of live hogs are "light mixed, \$3.10 to \$3.45; mixed packing, \$3.15 to \$3.50; heavy shipping, \$3.15 to \$3.50; rough grades, \$3.15 to \$3.25."

HALIFAX AND ST JOHN PRICES

A Good Price for Potatoes Given in Halifax.

HALIFAX, Nov 15.—There is a good deal of country produce coming in. Potatoes are high, selling for 35c and 40c. P. E. Island potatoes are fully as high as the Nova Scotia article. Eggs, in cases, bring from 15c to 16c. Oats, in bags, are worth from 35 to 36c.

ST JOHN, Nov 14.—The Sun reports P. E. Island mess pork selling at \$15.50 to \$16, and Island prime mess at from \$11 to \$12. Island prime mess is reported to have a lower range, with domestic mess firm.

Situation in Cuba.

HAVANA, Nov 15.—General Calixto Garcia and his staff and other delegates from the so-called Cuban Assembly will remain at their Marianna headquarters until Wednesday, when they will leave for Washington. The delegates expect a satisfactory outcome of their conference with the President of the United States.

The Cuban delegates at their last session at Santa Cruz Del Sur resolved to discharge all men who have been enlisted since August 14, the date of the cessation of the hostilities, and to give an indefinite leave of absence to all officers and men desirous of being discharged from the Cuban army, providing they give their place of residence and sign a pledge to return to the ranks in case they are called up on to do so.
