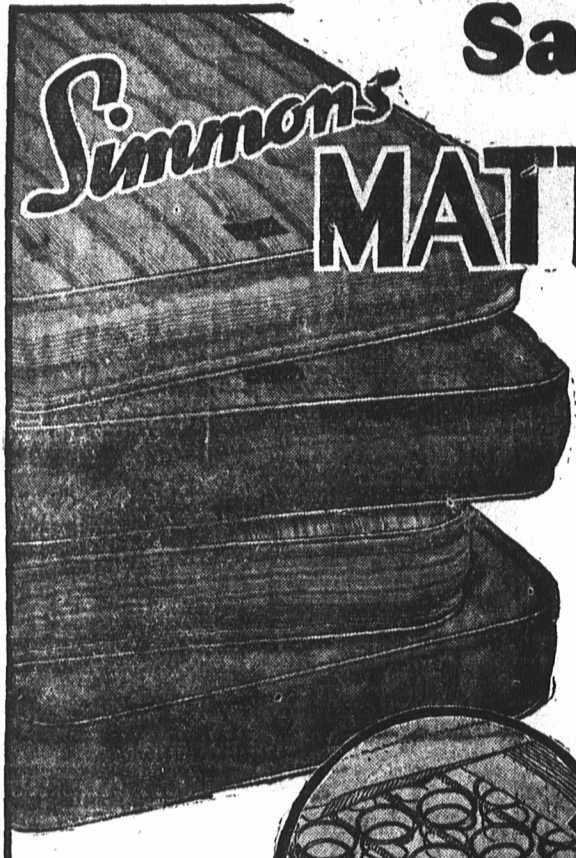
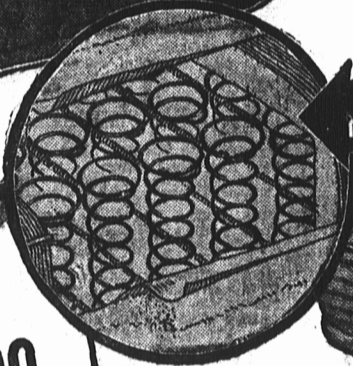

One Fatality In Jamaica Strike

KINGSTON, Jamaica, June 21—Police bullets killed one man today in a clash between officers and a crowd gathered near a Kingston wharf amid tension growing over the city's waterfront strike. When the group ignored orders to disperse, police opened fire and sent several bullets toward the mob. One man—an unemployed—was the only person hit, and he died a few hours later in hospital. Police, who had been patrolling the city with armed soldiers all night, said the crowd had displayed a "threatening attitude" when told to scatter.

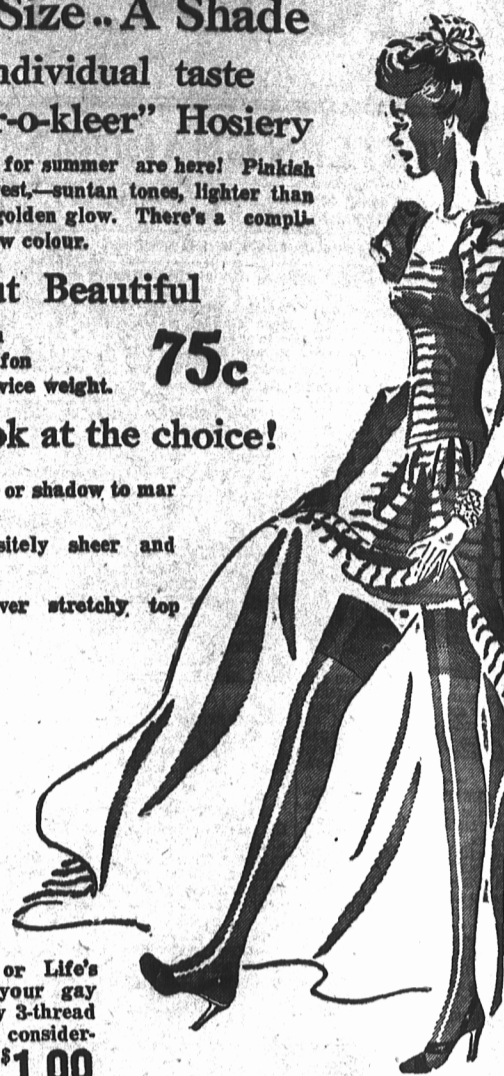
