

**Air and Water.**

A quart of water is daily passing through the skin of a sound person. 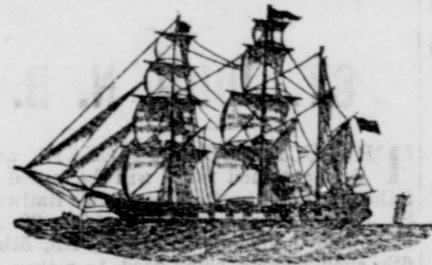

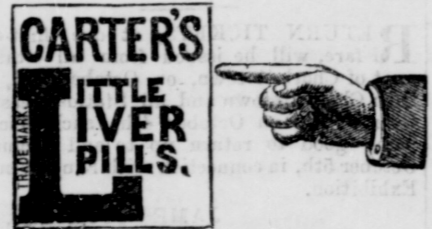
