

UPEI Plans Open House

The University of Prince Edward Island is planning an Open House as part of National Universities' Week which runs October 14-22. The Open House is scheduled for Saturday, October 21st and Sunday, October 22nd.

UPEI President Dr. C.W.J. Eliot looks forward to welcoming the people of PEI to the campus. "I offer a very warm welcome to Islanders who gave so generously to the Challenge of the Eighties campaign for the renovation of Main Building," he said. "I think you will like what we've done with it," said Dr. Eliot. "Also after several years of development on campus we are looking forward to showing the public the new Food Technology Centre, and as much of the new Field House now under construction, as safety will allow."

The various faculties of the University are planning displays and demonstrations for the Open House.

The Faculty of Veterinary Medicine (A.V.C.) will be opening their new building to the public. According to Dr. Brian Hill the Acting Dean, there will be demonstrations of veterinary surgery, aquarium care, radiolog-

ical diagnostics, and especially for the youngsters, a petting zoo, plus many other exhibits and demonstrations. All will be manned by students of the Atlantic Veterinary College.

Other areas of the UPEI campus will feature displays and demonstrations to show what goes on at a university. For example, the Business School is planning to show some of the students' policy projects, some of which in the past have become viable business ventures.

Some exciting displays and demonstrations are planned by the Science Department and the Music Faculty will be providing entertainment at various points across the campus.

The UPEI Bookstore will be open on the Saturday of the Open House and they are planning a T-Shirt draw. The Student Union will open the Barn to the public on both days and they are planning some musical entertainment for visitors.

"We hope that as many high school students as possible and their parents will come onto our campus because this will be an opportunity for them to see our fine facilities and the high stan-

dard of university education we offer here at UPEI," said Dr. Eliot.

The activities of National Universities' Week are aimed at the high school students of Canada, the theme of which this year is "Prime Time to Open Your Mind."

When construction is completed, UPEI will be taking responsibility for the sports complex and supervision will fall under the University's Athletic Association.

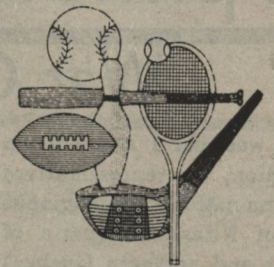
Students will Still Have a say in the operation of the House in areas of Intramural programs and Intercollegiate programs. Students will also be employed in areas of the House such as front desk.

Also discussed in the report is the athletic fee that Full-time students pay every year, and whether a new or increased fee will be imposed for use of the complex. Ed Hilton, Athletic director at UPEI does not believe a new fee will be imposed, but it still has not been determined.

The Athletic fee provides students with the chance to get involved in intramural programs,

aerobic classes, use of all equipment, and much more.

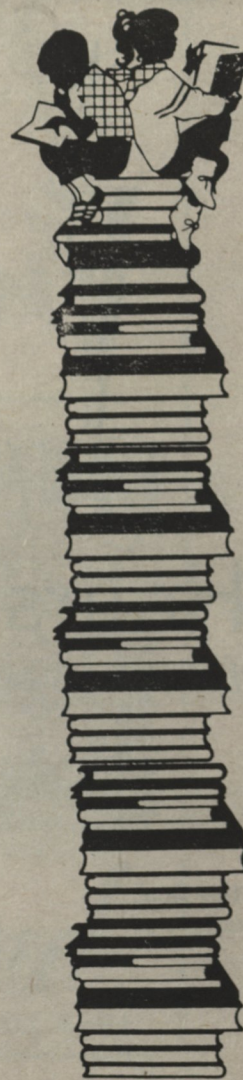
