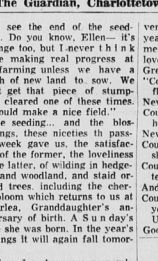

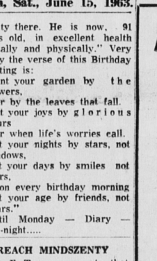

Gardening Now Recalls Memories Of Long Ago

"His eyes are blue, the exact shade of the orange kitten," Alex smiled, bending this morning to look into the heart of the seedling of yellow pansy we had recently transplanted to a border. . . . Ideal weather for setting out plants having obtained of late, we transplanted the rooted geranium slips, pansies from a nursery, a petunia or two to give the lawn an evening fragrance, and roots of a silver-folged plant, which returned to us memories of a home of the long ago, where beside a welcoming doormat these grew in a silvery profusion.

The child's gardens return so easily to mind, orderly plots, sometimes the beds outlined with the large braced shells of clams harvested out on "the bars," beaten weedless paths leading one to the white-striped ribbons, feathery "spanglers," crimson "piney" roses, scented boys' love, plummy bleeding hearts, tiny-faceted Johnny-jump-ups, the sweet hay and fragrant cabbage rose, and all the delightful growings of a garden of that elder day. Continued seeding, the farmers this name did today, wandering if that first-sown from seed gathered from last year's

well, see the end of the seedling. Do you know, Ellen—it's strange too, but I never think we're making real progress at the farming unless we have a patch of new land to sow. We must get that piece of stumpled cleared one of these times. It would make a nice field."

The seeding... and the blessings, these nieces in passing week gave us, the satisfaction of the former, the loveliness of the latter; of wilding in hedge-row and woodland, and staid orchard trees including the cherry-bloom which returns in us at Alderlea. Granddaughter's anniversary of birth. A sun day's babe she was born. In the year's turnings it will again fall tomorrow.

Other June-born we remember there are, young and older, island-over and afar. To this girl of the house across the lane, our one granddaughter, and to all, we send now lines kindly shared with us by the Doctor, who brought James' namesake: James, to see the light of day.
