

Fines Levied For Race-Fixing

PROVIDENCE, R. I., Jan. 24—(AP)—George Saybol, 42, of Whitestone, L. I., alleged "money man" in the Rhode Island race-fixing scandal, was fined \$500 and costs on one charge and given a suspended sentence on another today.

Saybol received a maximum two-year suspended state prison sentence with the maximum two years' probation.

Saybol was fined for corrupting jockey Pat Moore in a race at Narragansett Park Sept. 23, 1950. Moore rode a horse named Blunt, which though a 9-5 favorite, ran fourth.

Kanall was fined on a charge of corrupting Moore with a \$300 payment to pull a horse at Lincoln Downs Nov. 6, 1950.

Churches To Confer On Racial Question

CAPETOWN, Jan. 24—(Reuters)—The council of South African churches today called for a national convention of all races to discuss Prime Minister Daniel F. Malan's white supremacy policy.

The church council represents all Protestant Churches in South Africa—except of the Dutch Reformed Church, the country's largest religious body and one sympathetic to the nationalist administration.

Methodist Congregationalist and Presbyterian churches condemned the segregation policy at their own conventions.

Rev. Michael Scott, who this month championed the case of the five Herero tribes of Southwest Africa who wanted to appear before the U. N. to voice complaints about South African administration.

These people pointed out that against a white population of just over 2,000,000 there are 9,000,000 non-Europeans who want an active part in their administration.

Consumers' Ass'n Meet

TORONTO, Jan. 24—(CP)—The Canadian Association of Consumers has expressed concern over what it termed "confusion" created in the public mind regarding the effect of recent legislation banning resale-price maintenance.

A statement released at the end of a closed meeting of its board of directors said press comment has been "critical" of the power of the legislation to lower prices.

"This tends to encourage the public to expect few results from an act which as yet has had little time to function and which was not specifically directed to this end," said the C.A.C.

Resale price maintenance was discussed during the one-day meeting when delegates also studied reports sent in by the provincial presidents of the 13,000-member organization.

A report from Mrs. C. M. Suggitt of Saskatoon, Saskatchewan's provincial president, told of "thrift" teas where women gathered for quilting bees, mending parties or to exchange old clothes.

Recently the Ontario executive voted Mrs. Graban \$100 travelling expenses to make a field trip through the province. She visited Hamilton, Simcoe, Brantford, London, St. Catharines, Ridgeway, Niagara Falls, Toronto, Oshawa—and still had some of the \$100 left over.

I.O.D.E. Protests

At a recent Meeting of the National Executive Committee of the Imperial Order Daughters of the Empire, the following Resolution was passed regarding the continued governmental process of dissolving the ties that bind the Canadian people to the Crown:

"THAT WHEREAS in 1867 the Fathers of Confederation decreed that the New Nation should be known as "one Dominion under the name of Canada," and WHEREAS it would seem to be a singularly happy choice of a word to describe Canada's extent from sea to sea, and WHEREAS the proposal to obliterate the name Dominion would not seem to have had the approval of the two Houses of Parliament, and WHEREAS Parliament is apparently to be denied the opportunity of debate, and WHEREAS the word Dominion has sentimental connotations for the Canadian people, and WHEREAS the Imperial Order Daughters of the Empire has a representative membership of women from coast to coast, and WHEREAS the members of the Empire feel that the action of the Government is astonishing and regrettable,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Imperial Order Daughters of the Empire deplore and protest the fact that the policy of the Government "is" to replace the same Dominion of Canada with the single word "Canada."

Copies of this Resolution were sent to the Prime Minister, the other party leaders in the House of Commons, to all members of the Cabinet, and to the two party leaders in the Senate.

Riots Continue In Tunisia

By CARTER L. DAVISON TUNIS, Tunisia, Jan. 24—(AP)—Tunisian nationalists in bloody demonstrations against French rule rioted around the Sousse area today and seized control of the town of Teboulba.

At least 11 persons were killed in the day's disorders. An authorized French source said Teboulba, 20 miles southeast of the port of Sousse, was "in the hands of uncontrolled elements" tonight.

French Plan Operation

He said the French planned an operation tomorrow to retake the town.

Seven Tunisians were killed today at Teboulba in a clash between police and nationalists demonstrating for self-rule of Tunisia.

At Mokhine, a few miles away, three French policemen were killed. Mokhine is 120 miles southeast of Tunis.

The bodies of the police killed at Mokhine were found by a rescue force dispatched to the scene after demonstrators sacked the local police station and attacked the police barracks. Two other policemen seized by the crowd as hostages were released later, both wounded.

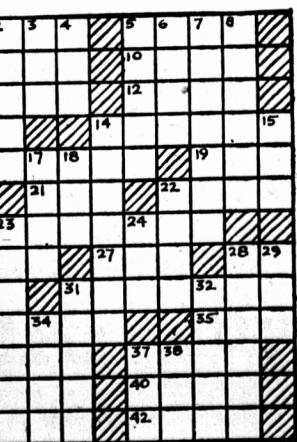
