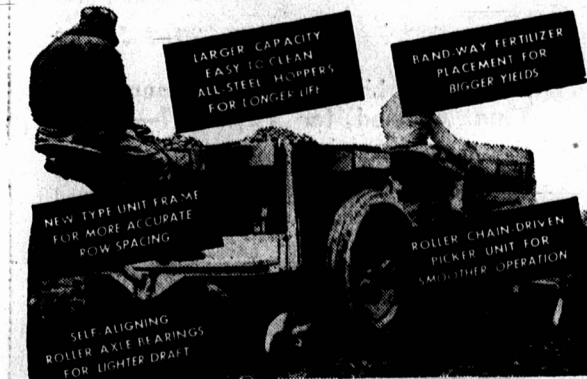

At the Conservative convention for the First District of Kings, held at the Sours Theatre yesterday afternoon, Mr. Melvin J. MacQuaid, barrister, was chosen as Councillor. Mr. John F. MacLean, merchant, as Assemblyman.
Mr. MacQuaid's nomination was moved by Leith Thompson, Sours, seconded by Daniel Murphy, Elmira. Mover and seconder for Mr. MacLean were Hugh MacKinnon, Rollo Bay, and Clarence Ching, Red Point.
There were no other nominees. Chairman of the meeting was J. Frank Sterns, the secretary being Henry Mallard.
Following the speeches of the two candidates, several others spoke including Dr. A. A. MacDonald, N. H. Richards, Harry Mallard, Preston Brynton, Peter D. Conway, and Harry Burke.

Mr. J. Augustine Gallant, barrister, Summerside, was the choice of the Progressive Conservative Party as Assemblyman, and Mr. Major MacDonald, meat dealer, Summerside was nominated as Councillor for the third district of Prince in the forthcoming provincial election, at a meeting held last night in the Town Hall, Summerside.
Mr. Gallant's nomination was moved by Cyrus P. Gallant, Urbainville, and seconded by Arsene P. Gallant also of Urbainville. Mr. Gallant is the son of Mr. Peter Gallant who contested this district in the last provincial election.
The nomination of Mr. MacDonald was moved by Russell Yeo, of Harmony, supported by Kenneth Harrington, Spring Valley, and seconded by Robert Phillips, Summerside.
The meeting was addressed by the candidates and by Colonel E. H. Strong, George Keys, Robert Dewar, Chester MacDonald, Peter Gallant, Alphonse Brown and Robert Phillips.

The meeting which was presided over by John F. Arsenault of Wellington, passed a resolution of condolence to the family of the late Mr. Heath Strong on his passing and also went on record as regretting the absence of Flight Lieut. Edward Arnett, candidate in the last provincial election and presently stationed at airforce headquarters in Ottawa.
Mr. Albert Robinson was secretary of the meeting.
At Thursday's Conservative convention at Eidon at which Messrs. Charlottetown, commencing the week of April 30, also on Thursday evening, April 19, at 7:30 o'clock, a concert for the senior contestants. These concerts are for the purpose of raising funds for the transportation of the chorus groups. Mrs. J. P.
